

Dr. Scott Glotfelty Humanitarian Award

This award is designed to recognize a 4-H member for their humanitarian efforts, not only their skills but the use of those skills as they relate to helping others in their club community. The award recipient, chosen by the Glotfelty family, will receive a saving bond and plaque. The Glotfelty family will present the award at the annual 4-H Achievement Program.

The late Dr. Glotfelty was a 4-H member in Garrett County for 12 years, a graduate of the University of MD, and the Maryland/Virginia Veterinary School. Upon graduation from veterinary school, Dr. Glotfelty received the David M. Bogash Memorial Award for humanitarian services. At the time of his death, he was serving as a member of the Peace Corp in Togo, Africa.

Criteria:

- Presented to a Senior Level 4-H member - (14 + older)
- May receive only once
- Service and Humanitarian efforts to family, club and community are the basis for the selection, not the numbers of awards, projects completed, etc.

Selection Process:

- The leader(s) of each 4-H Club are asked to nominate a member of their club. Club leaders or family members may complete the form on the back of this notice and return it to the Extension Office by March 14, 2008
- A committee including representative of the Glotfelty family will make the final selection.
