



KENT COUNTY FAIR 4-H OVERNIGHT PASS APPROVAL
For 4-H Livestock Exhibitors



1. 4-H youth exhibitors that remain on the Fairgrounds overnight must have on file in the Extension Office, a current: 1. Behavioral Expectation Form, 2. 4-H Health Statement and 3. MD 4-H Code of Animal Science Ethics Form and 4. Overnight Pass Approval Form. These forms must be filled out, signed by the 4-H member and parent or guardian and returned to the Extension Office **by June 15, 2009.**
2. Each barn will have approved chaperones, who will remain in the barn all night. Chaperones **MUST** remain all night or have a replacement relieve them. All Chaperones will be MCE Certified and have completed a Fair Chaperone Job Description if they are responsible for a 4-H'er other than their own child(ren).
3. There will be no more than 10 exhibitors per chaperone.
4. Youth 18 years and under, without animal project responsibilities, may stay on the grounds overnight if their parents are designated Chaperones on the fairgrounds, (i.e.: They have no one to go home to.) Behavioral Expectation, Health Statement and Overnight Pass forms must be signed for that child.
5. It is a privilege and a responsibility for 4-H'ers to stay overnight at the fair. The 4-H'er agrees to follow the 4-H Behavioral Expectations, all Fair rules & guidelines and follow directions given by designated chaperone, 4-H staff and Fair Board members. 4-H'er also agrees to attend overnight orientation session as directed by Extension Staff to make sure paper work is in order, review guidelines and handout wristbands. Anyone not attending an orientation, will not be able to stay overnight on the fairgrounds.
6. 4-H'er agrees to wear a Kent County Fair overnight wristband indicating approval for overnight stay.
7. During the Fair, this form must be completed with chaperone signatures and returned to fair office by 9:00 p.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings. Anyone not having form in by 9:00 p.m., will not be permitted to stay on the fair grounds. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
8. 4-H'er and Chaperone/Parents must be in the same designated area – either a barn or a camper. Chaperones cannot sign for 4-H'ers who will not be in their area.
