# Session Two Outline: Space and Movement

### Introduction

The activity encourages individuals to interpret and analyze art in order to understand space in a piece of two dimensional artwork

Positive space is described as the shapes that make up the design, whereas, the negative space is everything else



### Goals

Be able to identify and differentiate between negative and positive space



### **Learning outcomes**

- Understanding and applying media, techniques, and processes
- Comprehend space in a piece of two dimensional artwork
- Creating a composition comprising of positive and negative space
- Through art, youth practice creativity
- Using the knowledge of understanding positive and negative space to create and comprehend two dimensional pieces of artwork

## **Activity: Love Me, Love Me Not (Positive and Negative Shapes)**

Encourage participants to experiment and construct shapes to develop their understanding of

positive and negative space. Follow through with the discussion.

### **Activity Instructions:**

**Step 1:** Gather these basic materials: 2 small pieces sheets of construction (4"x6") paper in contrasting colors; a marker, crayon, or a pencil; scissors; and a glue stick.

**Step 2:** Fold one sheet of construction in half like a book. Draw a simple shape (a heart), starting and finishing at the fold. Cut out the shape and keep the paper from which you cut the shape.



**Step 3:** Using the fold line as guide, cut the shape and the leftover paper in half. You will have two half-shapes and two half-shape outlines.

**Step 4:** Fold the second sheet of paper in half. Glue on of the half-shape outlines on one side of the fold line, and one of the half-shapes on the other side.

**Step 5:** Show your work and attach it on the activity page in the book or create your own Activity Page.

### **Discussion:**

Ask participants to:

Share: What are different areas of the artwork? Which areas represent positive and negative space?

Reflect: Using your own words describe and define positive and negative space.

Generalize: A tree and its branches represent positive space while the sky represents negative space. Provide some other examples of positive and negative you can find in the world around you?

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Apply: A kicker on a football team needs to find negative space between the goal posts to make a field goal. Name at least one other way an awareness of positive and negative space can be important.
