

LEAD Maryland Fellowship Program Reference Form

Instruction for the Fellowship applicant: The applicant must ask three (3) people to provide references. The references should be submitted directly to the LEAD Maryland Foundation, not the applicant.

Be sure to approach people with your request well in advance of the October 1 deadline. Give this form to a person you believe can comment on the nature and scope of your character, leadership, and service potential, and your readiness to successfully complete a two-year fellowship.

Choose people such as trusted co-workers, clients, and community members. References are not to be completed by relatives and close personal friends.

Please share this form as needed, so that each person asked to supply a reference has this form available.

Instructions for the person completing the form: Thank you for assisting the LEAD Maryland Fellowship Program by providing a reference for the Fellowship applicant. The reference provides general support or description of the applicant's nature and scope of character, leadership and service potential, and their readiness to successfully complete a two-year fellowship.

The LEAD Maryland Foundation provides educational leadership development Fellowships. The Fellowship is intended for people who have demonstrated emerging leadership abilities and leadership potential in agriculture, food, natural resources, and/or rural communities. Applicants who may have already become strong leaders or have obtained a high level of development of personal and leadership skills, or have become proficient in their service to others, may not rank as high as those who show greater potential for growth through program participation. Fellows must have an ability and willingness to teach and share, at the same time they must have the maturity and readiness to learn, grow, and change to become leaders who serve others.
