

THE EVERYBODY'S QUILT GUILD TEXTILE ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

SELECTION CRITERIA

PURPOSE: The purpose of the Everybody's Quilt Guild Textile Arts Scholarship is to provide a scholarship for a student who is a resident of Carroll County, Maryland, Graduating from a Carroll County High School, a private High School or a student who is Home Schooled who has been accepted at an accredited College or University and who will be pursuing studies in the field of Textile Arts and meets all the criteria established for the Scholarship.

SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION CRITERIA:

A. Scholarship will be awarded to an applicant who meets the following criteria:

- 1. The student will be a Carroll County resident who is a member of a Carroll County High School graduation class, a student at a private high school or a home schooled student.
- 2. The student will have been accepted at an accredited college or university.
- 3. The student will have college worthy grades for his or her high school career and have college worthy SAT scores.

- 4. The student will have a demonstrated interest in pursuing a career in Textile Arts.
- 5. The student will have a letter of recommendation from a teacher or 4-H Leader.
- 6. The student will submit an essay of at least 500 words explaining the importance of and past history with community service, educational goals and career plans.
- 7. The student will submit a resume detailing their education, work experience, and community involvement.
- 8. The student will submit a short biography suitable for presentation of the scholarship award, & publication in The Everybody's Quilt Guild Newsletter, and local newspapers.

B. The administration of the scholarship shall be as follows:

- 1. The recipient(s) shall be selected by the Scholarship Committee or their designee, and approved by the Board of Directors of Everybody's Quilt Guild. Recipient will be asked to attend a guild meeting to be presented with the award.
- 2. The money shall be transmitted by Everybody's Quilt Guild directly to the desired college or university and applied directly to the student's tuition and books. The award will be split between semesters. The monies shall not be remitted to the recipient.
