Senior 4-H Member Opportunity for Higher Level Leadership and Travel!

The Maryland 4-H Program is proud to offer senior 4-H members the opportunity to participate national level leadership trip opportunities through the Maryland 4-H Leadership Trips and the Senior Portfolio Process.

Eligibility: All Maryland 4-H members ages 14-18 (as of January 1st the year of the trip) are eligible to apply to attend one of the five national leadership trip opportunities listed below. To be considered, individuals must apply through the 4-H Online Event and submit a Senior 4-H Portfolio (essay and resume) and participate in an interview. Senior 4-H Portfolios for all National Leadership

trips are due by January 15th. Local 4-H Programs will review and approve portfolios for the National Leadership Trip period and for National 4-H Conference.

Application and Portfolio Submission Process:

Youth may wish to have their local 4-H Educator for review their essay and resume before submitting, but must submit their Senior 4-H Portfolio through the 4-H Online Event portal by January 15th. 4-H Educators will approve portfolios in the 4-H Online Event portal for state level review and processing. Youth should receive notification from their 4-H Educator regarding their portfolio submission and will be contacted by the interview site coordinator to schedule their interview time. Youth will be contacted by the State Leadership Trip Coordinator regarding the outcome of the judging process and whether they will be awarded a trip.

Essay: 20% of overall portfolio score

The essay should answer the annual theme or question posted on the 4-H website at:

- Double spaced
- Marains no less than 1 inch
- Font Size no less than 12 pt.
- Font Type Times New Roman
- For some life skills suggestions, please refer to the Targeting Life Skills Model. Essays will be reviewed and scored by three anonymous judges using the Essay Scoresheet.

Resume: 40% of overall portfolio score

The resume should highlight your 4-H career and youth development experiences. A sample 4-H Resume is available on the 4-H website at:

- Leadership, Citizenship and Life skills based
- Length no more than three pages
- Single spaced
- Margins no less than 1 inch
- Font Size no less than 12 pt.
- Font Type Times New Roman

Resumes will be reviewed and scored by three anonymous judges using the Resume Scoresheet.

Interview: 40% of overall portfolio score

Youth will participate in three 10-12 minute interviews with 1-2 judges in each of the following areas: Citizenship, Leadership and Life Skills. Each interviewer/panel will ask applicants the same set of questions focusing on the three topic areas and will score them using the Interview Scoresheet. Selection:

An applicant's average essay, resume and interview score is compiled to determine their overall portfolio score. An applicant's overall score and trip preferential ranking (for National Leadership Trips) are used to select delegates for all National Leadership Trips with a minimum score for consideration (80 for Leadership Trips and 85 for Conference). Trip decisions and offers including number of delegates per trip are subject to change from year to year and are the discretion of the Maryland 4-H State Office and the Maryland 4-H Foundation.
