Senior 4-H Portfolio Program

This document, along with all of the resources and information on the State 4-H webpage are designed to help prepare youth to apply for these opportunities. Contact your local 4-H Educator if you need specific help with this process.

The Senior 4-H Portfolio Program is used by the State 4-H program to select delegates to represent Maryland at the five National 4-H Leadership Opportunities which are supported by the Maryland 4-H Program and the Maryland 4-H Foundation. This portfolio consists of a resume and essay and to be considered for one of these five leadership trips, it must be submitted by a 4-H through the National 4-H Leadership Trips Application (Event in 4-H Online) by January 15th. Applicants must be interviewed through the interview process described in this document.

To be eligible, a 4-H member must be 14 as of January 1st (the year of the trip). Members must be enrolled and approved in 4-H Online in order to submit their application. Individuals may attend each trip only once in a calendar year and a maximum of 3 leadership trips during their 4-H career.

Portfolio Package: Resume

- Leadership, Citizenship and Life skills based
- Length no more than three pages
- · Single spaced
- Margins no less than 1 inch
- Font Size no less than 12 pt.
- Font Type Times New Roman
- Scored anonymously by three judges using the Resume Scoresheet (available on the State 4-H webpage)
- Maximum points= 40



Portfolio Package: Essay

- Must be written in response to the annual theme available on the State 4-H webpage
- Length no more than two pages
- Double spaced
- Margins no less than 1 inch
- Font Size no less than 12 pt.
- Font Type Times New Roman
- For some life skills suggestions, please refer to the Targeting Life Skills Model.
- Scored anonymously by three judges using the Essay Scoresheet (available on the State 4-H webpage)
- Maximum points= 20

Portfolio Process: Interview

- Held at regional location(s) on set dates.
 Applicants for National Leadership Trips will have a choice of three locations to select from. Virtual interview opportunities will also be available at select locations.
- Interviewed by a small group of judges on topic 3 areas (civic

engagement, leadership and life skills) according to the Interview Score Sheets (available on the State 4-H webpage).

Selection Process:

- Senior 4-H Portfolios for state consideration must be submitted through <u>4-H Online</u> (Event Registration) by the designated state deadline. Local 4-H Educators may review portfolios for review and may set earlier deadlines for their jurisdiction.
- 2) Portfolios approved in 4-H Online by the local 4-H Educator by the state deadline will be considered for state review and processing. Essays and resumes will be judged by three anonymous judges coordinated by the State 4-H Office. An individual's essay scores and resume scores will be averaged for the cumulative score.
- 3) Interviews will be conducted and an individual's interview scoresheets will be averaged for the cumulative score.
- 4) Averaged essay, resume and interview scores are combined to attain an individual's overall total score out of 100 points possible. Individuals must meet the minimum score established by the Awards & Recognition Committee to be awarded a trip (80% for Leadership Trips and 85% for Conference).
