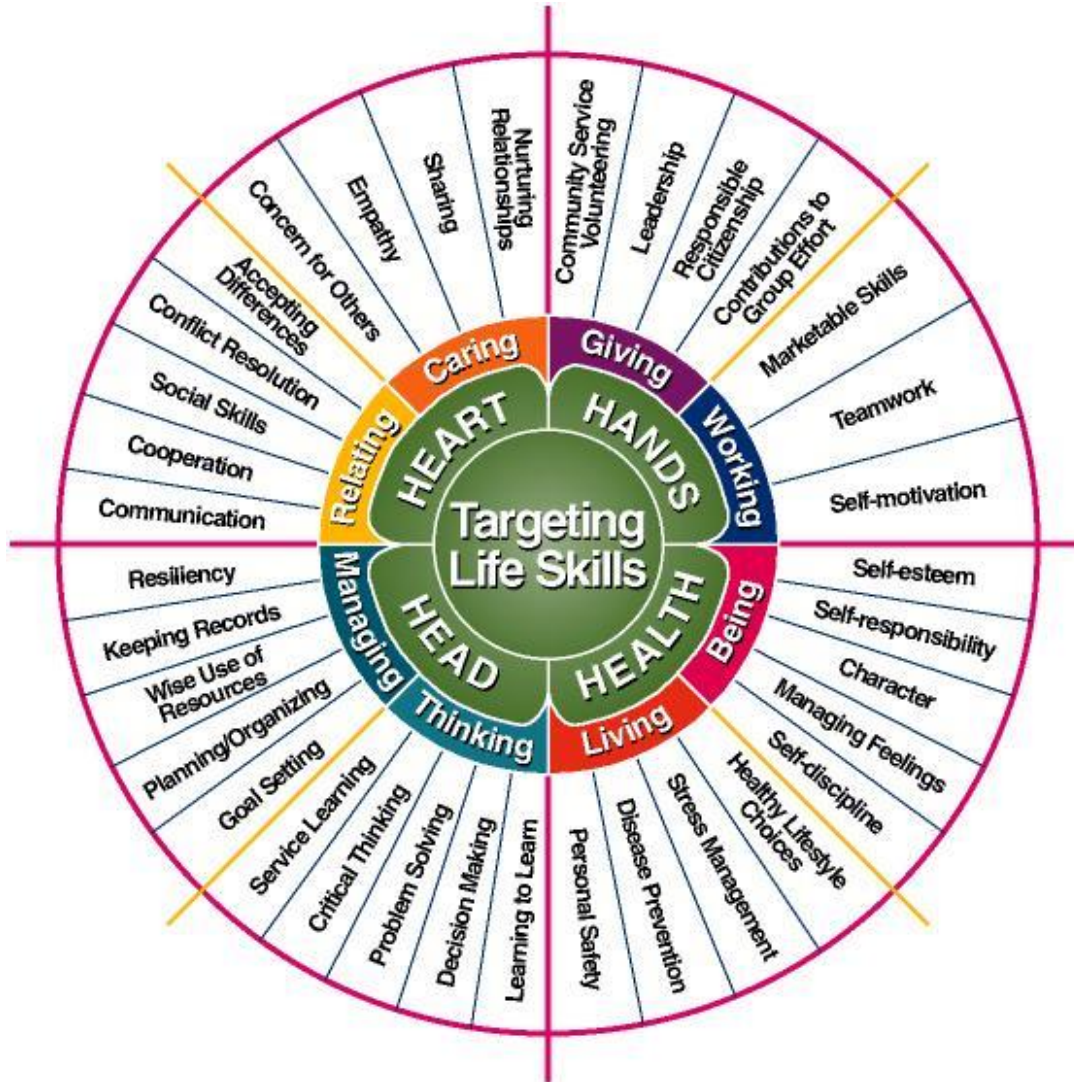
### Examples
