

The Clover Community 4-H Club won Reserve Champion Mixed Team with their Spanish Chicken and Rice dish. Here is the recipe if you would like to try at home!

Spanish Chicken and Rice

In a skillet, melt 2 T of butter over medium heat. Add 4 cups of diced tomatoes, a 1/2 cup of diced onion, 1 cup of chopped green pepper, 1/2 teaspoon of salt and 1/4 teaspoon of garlic powder. Cook for 5 minutes. Next add 1 cup of long grain rice and 2 cups of chicken broth. Cook on low heat until the broth is absorbed and the rice is tender. Next add 1 1/2 cups of cooked, cubed chicken and 1 cup of grated cheese.







The Paws and Claws 4-H Club won Junior Champion with their dessert, no bake cheesecake parfait with apple maple topping. Here is the recipe if you would like to try it at home!

Maple Apple Cheesecake Parfaits

1 1/2 cups of graham cracker crumbs

1/3 C sugar

6 T of butter

Mix all of the above ingredients and set aside.

Apple Maple Topping:

1/4 C sugar

1 1/2 t cinnamon

5 apples, peeled, cored and sliced

1 T butter

2 T maple syrup

2 t vanilla

Melt the butter, add apples and remaining ingredients to a skillet, cook until well mixed and apples are softened.

Cheesecake Filling

18 oz package of cream cheese

1 C powdered sugar

1 t vanilla

1/2 C heavy cream

1/2 C sour cream

Beat all ingredients together using a hand mixer except the heavy cream. Blend until smooth. Add cream and mix until thickened.

To assemble parfaits, add graham cracker crust to the bottom of a glass or jar. Next add a tablespoon or more of the cheesecake filling followed by the apples. Top with additional graham crackers if desired.







The Cloverettes and Friends won Champion Mixed Team with their One Pot Creamy Cajun Chicken Recipe including homemade pasta. Here is the recipe if you would like to try it at home!

To begin, prepare the Cajun seasoning in a small bowl: 2 t paprika, 1 t oregano, 1 t thyme, 1/2 t garlic powder, 1/2 t onion powder, 1/4 t cayenne pepper, 1/4 t black pepper and 1/4 t salt.

Next, cube 1 pound of boneless chicken breasts and place in a bowl. Add Cajun seasoning and stir to coat. In a skillet, heat 1 T olive oil and 1 T unsalted butter. Add chicken and cook on both sides. Add 1 diced yellow onion and cook until soft. Next, add a 15 oz can of fire roasted tomatoes and 2 cups of chicken broth. Decrease heat to medium low. Add pasta * and simmer until the pasta is tender and the sauce is thick. Next add 2 oz of cream cheese and stir until melted. Place the ingredients in a serving dish and top with grated parmesan and sliced green onions.

*Homemade Pasta: Combine 2 eggs, 1 egg yolk, 1/4 c of water and 1 T olive oil in a bowl. Whisk until blended. Next, on a clean surface, mound 2 cups of all purpose flour and 1/4 t of salt. Make a well in the center and add the wet ingredients. Mix together with a fork or clean hands, forming a soft sticky dough. Knead for 8-10 minutes or until smooth. Divide the dough into six balls. Cover with plastic wrap and allow to rest for at least 30 minutes. Run through pasta roller to desired thickness and cut of noodle.





The Black Horse 4-H Club won Reserve Champion Junior Team with their 7 Layer Salad. Here is the recipe if you would like to try it at home!

7 Layer Salad

To begin, cook 1 pound of bacon over high heat, turning until evenly cooked and browned. Drain on paper towels, crumble and set aside. In a large bowl, add one head of chopped iceberg lettuce. Next top with 1 chopped red onion followed by a 10 oz package of thawed, frozen green peas. Next add 10 ounces of shredded cheddar, followed by a layer of 1 cup of chopped cauliflower and finally the crumbled bacon. To complete the salad, prepare the dressing using 1 1/4 cups of mayonnaise, 2/3 cup of grated parmesan cheese and 2 tablespoons of white sugar. Mix in a bowl until smooth. Drizzle over salad and refrigerate until chilled.

Pretzel Cookies. Here is the recipe if you would like to try these at home!

Chocolate Chip Butterscotch Pretzel Cookies

Preheat oven to 350. Prepare 2 baking sheets with parchment and set aside. Using a stand mixer, beat 1 cup of butter, 1 cup of brown sugar and 1 cup of white sugar for about 3 minutes. Next add 2t of vanilla and mix. Add 2 eggs and one egg yolk, one at a time, beating after each addition. In a separate bowl, combine 2 1/2 cups of flour, 1/2 t salt, 1 t baking powder, and 1/4 t of baking soda. Once combined, slowly add to the wet mixture and stir. Add 1 1/4 c of chocolate chips, 1 1/4 cups of butterscotch chips and 1 cup of chopped pretzels. Gently combine using a rubber spatula. Scoop balls of dough on to prepared baking sheets. Using slightly damp fingers, press dough into a disk. Sprinkle with flaky sea salt and press one mini pretzel on the top of each cookie. Bake for 11-12 minutes or until the edges turn golden brown. Cool and enjoy!
