The Animal Husbandry and Quality Assurance (AHQA)

The Animal Husbandry and Quality Assurance (AHQA) system is now open for 2024! Members must be current on their AHQA to be eligible to exhibit animals at the 2024 MD 4-H Shows. The system can be accessed at: https://ahqa.umd.edu/. The link can also be found on the Animal Science Program Area page of the Maryland 4-H website.

The 2024 Maryland 4-H AHQA Information Sheet can be found at

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The sheet contains specific requirements, tips for navigating the program, and any other relevant information. All 4-H members enrolled in alpacas, beef, dairy, goats, horse and pony, llamas, poultry,

sheep, swine, and rabbits are required to have **completed the on-line training before July 15** to be eligible to exhibit their project animals in 2024 Montgomery County 4-H Shows.

The 2024 program must be completed using Firefox, Chrome, Edge, or Safari web browsers. Internet Explorer does not support this program. The narrated program contains two levels, a Junior-aged Level and an Intermediate/Senior-aged Level. The program automatically directs members to the correct level based on their birthdate. 4-Hers are required to complete the on-line training program when they reach each 4-H age division (juniors (8-10), intermediates (11-13), seniors (14-18) – all as of January 1 of the current year) OR when an Intermediate or Senior 4-H member chooses to show a new species since last completing the program within their age division - they must return to the program and complete it for the new species area (The Junior program does not have species-specific sections like the Intermediate/Senior program does). Passcodes issued to members between 2015-2023 should still be viable for returning members.

State 4-H Horse Judging Contest

The Horse Judging Contest is an event in which teams and individuals compete. Each county/city 4-H program may enter up to 10 youth contestants in each age division: a team of 3 or 4 youth members and 6 individual contestants.

State 4-H Hippology Contest

The Hippology Contest is an event in which individuals compete (no teams).

The Maryland 4-H Foundation Scholarships

The Maryland 4-H Foundation Scholarship Application for academic year 2024-2025 is open.

Registration must be submitted by 11:59 p.m., June 15, 2024.

The Maryland 4-H Foundation opportunity for academic scholarships to Maryland 4-H members and Maryland 4-H alum pursuing post-secondary education at a college, university or post-secondary technical training program. The Maryland 4-H Foundation awards an average of \$50,000 in scholarships annually.

Applicants must be a currently enrolled Maryland 4-H member or a Maryland 4-H Alumni in good standing who has completed at least two (2) years of membership in Maryland 4-H. They must be planning to enroll in an accredited college, university or post-secondary technical training program for both the fall and spring semesters of the 2024-2025 academic year.



*Students completing their post-secondary education in December of 2024 are ineligible to apply.

This event will provide an introduction to several agricultural and mechanical science-related 4-H/FFA project areas. Participants will learn general knowledge, safety, and requirements for 4-H/FFA Maryland State Fair competitive events in these projects.

Participants will provide their own food and drinks. Water and light snacks will be provided. It is strongly recommended that participants bring their lunch, drinks, and snacks due to limited availability of local dining options. Refrigerators will be available.

Participants are encouraged to bring their own bicycles as well as a properly fitted bicycle helmet.

Maryland 4-H Robotics Workshops

Registration for Session 2 must be submitted no later than by 11:59 p.m., June 19, 2024. Session 2, June 22, 2024, 1:00 - 5:00 p.m. Frederick County 4-H Campgrounds, Frederick MD.

Fee for youth participants \$10.00. No fee for adult Volunteer participants.

Each Session is limited to 30 4-H youth registrations. There is no limit on the number of 4-H Volunteers at each session.

The 2024 Maryland 4-H Robotics Workshops are intended for 4-H youth, and volunteer leaders/coaches who are considering or planning to participate in the annual Maryland 4-H Robotics Challenge at the 2024 Maryland State Fair.

The workshops will offer information about this year's robotics challenges, including the missions and specific rules relating to each challenge's theme. In addition, there will be breakout sessions focused on each of the two Maryland 4-H Robotics Challenges: the Lego Challenge and the Robotics Engineering Challenge (REC). Each breakout session will include challenge-specific rules, plus building and coding recommendations for teams that intend to compete. Finally, some general guidelines for coaches and teen leaders, including how to distribute team tasks, help teams manage their Engineering notebook, and how to prepare for their presentations, will be shared by event leaders and from members of teams who have competed in the past.

Fair Tickets and New Parking Location

As a 4-H'er, if you enter exhibits at the fair, you will get a free weekly pass!

As in the past, free and reduced-price entry tickets will be made available to 4-H members and their families. Purchasing can occur when you enter exhibits online or weekdays at the Fair Office between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. after July 15 or between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on one of the Volunteer Workdays on Saturday, July 20, 27, or August 3. After these dates, tickets are only available at the advertised price.

The following free tickets for Fair admission will be provided to 4-H'ers who enter exhibits:

- 4-H indoor exhibitors and those with poultry, rabbits, pet show, and dog show will be provided with 1 season pass that includes free parking at Perry Pkwy.
- 4-H exhibitors with horses, beef, dairy, swine, goats, and sheep will be provided with 1 season pass including free parking at all entrances.
- 4-H exhibitors with horses, beef, dairy, swine, goats, and sheep whose parents are not Life Members will be provided with an additional season pass including free parking at all entrances.

The following tickets are available for purchase by 4-H member families until 12:30 p.m. on the final Volunteer Saturday Workday.

- Season Pass that includes Free Parking at Perry Pkwy. only \$50.00
- Season Pass special pass for non-exhibitor sibling of a 4-H member (age 12-18) Perry Pkwy only -\$18.00
- 1 Day ticket 4-H Family, Free Parking at Perry Pkwy. only \$10.00
- 1 Day ticket 4-H Family, entrance only, no parking \$5.00


