#### 2021 Deadlines

- Poultry must be hatched by April 7, 2021
- Exhibitors must be enrolled in Poultry or Veterinary science project by May 1, 2021
- ALL poultry must be owned by June 1, 2021
- 4-H Code of animal science ethics due to 4-H office June 1, 2021
- Quality assurance
- Entries due mid June (watch tribune)
- Completion of 2020 project record sheet
- Completion of poultry orientation webinar & quiz or attend a in person orientation meeting.
- Entry changes due by July 17<sup>th</sup>



#### Fair Dates

- Friday July 30st poultry entered 10:00am-3:00pm
- Sunday August 1<sup>st</sup> clover show 3:00pm
- Sunday evening or Monday morning Meat birds entered
- Monday Aug. 2<sup>nd</sup> exhibits judged 9:00am
- Monday Aug. 2<sup>nd</sup> showmanship 1:00pm
- Thursday Aug. 5<sup>th</sup> poultry judging contest 10:00am
- Thursday Aug. 5<sup>th</sup> poultry awards 6:30pm
- Saturday Aug. 7<sup>th</sup> birds released 7:00-9:30am \*\*\*After 9:30am any remaining birds become property of the fair







#### Health Requirements



- PA residents must have a PA tester
- MD residents
  - 1. Premise registration
  - 2. Avian Influenza testing at least 15 birds all species 21 days prior to the fair
  - 3. Poultry Self-Certification 1-per exhibitor
  - 4. Pullorum typhoid testing


5. ALL Turkeys and meat birds must have blood drawn for PT testing regardless of age.

# New Entry System

- L39 breakdown
  - Bantam, eggs and posters, large fowl, market poultry, other poultry exhibit, poultry clover entry, poultry production, poultry showmanship, waterfowl
  - Alphabetical selection of breed and sex/age
- Identify the type of comb
- Identify bearded or non-bearded
- What's in the "other" category
- Posters 1 class this year check size
- Egg entry 6 eggs
- Maximum 2 birds per class max entry per exhibitor 16 birds, turkey, waterfowl



#### Expectations



- Feed/water twice a day barn volunteers will check and top off water throughout the day
- Sign up to volunteer in the barn
- Waterfowl sign up to provide feedexhibitors will rotate
- Notice trash cans for trash and other for dirty bedding



# Market Entry Changes



- Roaster 9-11 pounds
- Fryer 5-7 pounds
- Tom Turkey minimum 28 pounds
- Hen Turkey Minimum 20 pounds

 All meat birds and turkeys (meat or breed) on the property must be PT tested based on State Guidelines





Champion and reserve meat birds, Champion and reserve meat turkey, Champion and reserve eggs will sell Friday night at the livestock sale around 5:00pm

Meat birds must complete a market project record sheet to show next year.

# What to bring or leave at home



#### Bring to the fair:

- All health papers (4)
- Online entries
- Feed in a bucket or container with lid
- Barn donations 14" zip ties, paper towels, 16 oz plastic cups for food/water
- Snacks and drinks for exhibitors

#### Leave at home:

- Birds with lice-mites or signs of being sick
- Bad attitudes



There will be NO EXCEPTIONS this year. Pay close attention to reading coop tags and put your birds in the correct cages. If a bird is entered incorrectly it will remain at the fair but be **disqualified** and not judged.
