## Maryland 4-H Volunteer Refresher Training



The Volunteer Refresher training is now available! This training was created in response to requests from long serving volunteers for a “refresher” on volunteer expectations and supported by data from the 2019 Maryland 4-H Volunteer Needs Assessment where volunteers expressed a clear need for training on 4-H Program Management competencies. It is designed to “refresh” an individual’s knowledge and understanding of volunteer and 4-H expectations and is intended for those who have served for five or more years as of 2020 (on-boarded as a UME 4-H Volunteer in 2015 or earlier).
