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Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair Entries

The online fair entry system is **open and will close at 11:59pm on June 10th**. Remember, the Fair has switched entry systems and are now using ShoWorks, which is why the system will look different this year. If you have already made an account for this year, you need to use the same account. If you have not used the fair online entry system this year, you will need to make a new account. Make sure to get your fair entries entered early and not wait until the last minute. The online entry system can be found at www.carrollcountyfair.com You will need to go to the exhibitors tab and then click on online entry system. **No late entries will be accepted.** If you need to use a computer to complete entries, stop by the Extension Office between 8am-4pm and we will help you. Carroll County 4-H Reopening Update

We are finally able to relax some of our guidelines as of June 1st!! We are no longer requiring any 4-H meeting/activity to have prior approval and you will not have to fill out the 4-H Health Pledges any more. We are still required to keep an attendance sheet for all 4-H activities and leaders/volunteers leading programs have to complete the post-activity report. All outdoor programs are not required to wear masks, but be aware of social distancing (3 ft apart). All programs inside still need to wear masks.

Remember that the Extension Office is open! If you need to stop by to drop off or pick up any items, remember that you **MUST** wear a face mask when entering the building. 4-H Remote Skills Camp

In this course participants will meet other youth from around the country, hear from speakers who have made remote careers in Google, You-tube, Microsoft, photography and more. The course is designed to give participants a feel for the pace and feel of a college course. The course can be completed from anywhere with WiFi (on a smart phone, iPad, or computer with video and audio) and students average 8 hours of work per week over a period of 4 weeks. Each week has 2 live meetings over zoom. If the course is completed with 80% or higher, students receive a remote work certificate of the same level and validity as offered through the adult professional development course. It is recognized by many remote employers in Utah and other areas of the country. Livestock Skillathon

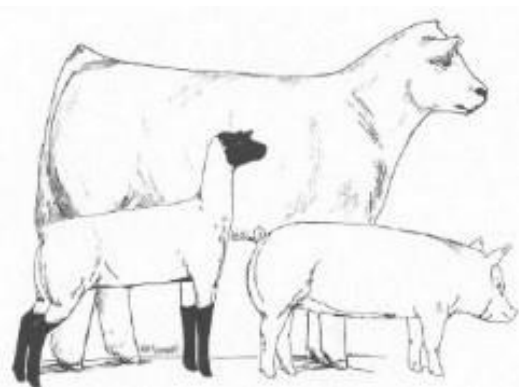

Livestock Judging

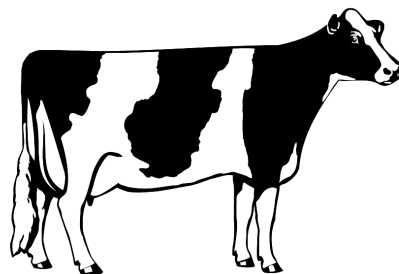

The online program is required for ALL 4-H members showing beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats, horses/ponies, poultry, rabbits and alpacas/llamas. When the website is opened by Maryland 4-H, you will need to register and complete this program if you are planning to show at any 4-H show. UME Volunteers

ALL UME Volunteers SHOULD HAVE COMPLETED THEIR ENROLLMENT BY MARCH 1, 2021 on 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com). This new deadline is a Maryland 4-H requirement to meet the new background check requirements. Even if you missed the March 1st deadline, we will still work with getting you enrolled! When completing the volunteer enrollment, remember this is a two-step process. Step 1 is the enrollment which leads into step 2, the screening process.

Please note that the state will be approving the screening section of all volunteers once the background checks have been completed and before the county office can approve enrollments. Most volunteers will be considered a Tier 2 volunteer which will consist of a \$15 background check fee completed by a private company. This will be conducted every 3 years.

Some of our volunteers will be considered a Tier 3 volunteer which will consist of a background check along with fingerprinting and will cost around \$55. Volunteers in Tier 3 who work with camp (residential and day camps) or chaperone over night trips with 4-H members will fall under Tier 3.

4-H is a **community** of **young people** across America who are learning **leadership, citizenship** and **life skills.**

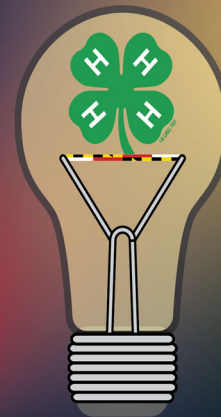
