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Carroll County 4-H Reopening Update

Many 4-H programs have started to meet in-person now! Remember, we are following all of the Maryland 4-H guidelines and we will have to limit group sizes to 35 or less individuals for indoor and outdoor events at this time. I will be working with our club leaders and volunteer led programs to work through all of the procedures for approving meetings/events. Before attending any in-person event, please be on the lookout for information with specific guidelines that will need to be followed including: social distancing, wearing a mask, and signed health pledges (copy attached to the end of *Tribune*) just to name a few. Please read through the *Tribune* carefully as you will find that many of our spring activities are taking place in-person, but we are requiring registration to ensure we stay within our group size limits.

The Extension Office is now open! Faculty and Staff are working on a rotational basis. At this time, Becky is in the office on Mondays and Wednesdays and Lori is there on Mondays and Thursdays if you have a specific 4-H need or need to pick up anything. Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair Entries

The online fair entry system will be opening on May 17th and will close at 11:59pm on June 10th. Remember, the Fair has switched entry systems and is now using ShoWorks, which is why the system will look different this year. Remember, if you have already made an account for this year, you need to use the same account. If you have not used the fair online entry system this year, you will need to make a new account. Make sure to get your fair entries entered early and don't wait until the last minute. The online entry system can be found at www.carrollcountyfair.com No late entries will be accepted. If you need to use a computer to complete entries, stop by the Extension Office between 8am-4pm and we will help you. If you have any problems with the entry system, contact:

UME Volunteers

ALL UME Volunteers SHOULD HAVE COMPLETED THEIR ENROLLMENT BY MARCH 1, 2021 on 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com). This new deadline is a Maryland 4-H requirement to meet the new background check requirements. Even if you missed the March 1st deadline, we will still work with getting you enrolled! When completing the volunteer enrollment, remember this is a two-step process. Step 1 is the enrollment which leads into step 2, the screening process.

Please note the state will be approving the screening section of all volunteers once the background checks have been completed and before the county office can approve enrollments. Most volunteers will be considered a Tier 2 volunteer which will consist of a \$15 background check fee completed by a private company. This will be conducted every 3 years.

Some of our volunteers will be considered a Tier 3 volunteer which will consist of a background check along with fingerprinting and will cost around \$55. Volunteers in Tier 3 who work with camp (residential and day camps) or chaperone over night trips with 4-H members will fall under Tier 3.

Demonstration Contest

It's time to start thinking about **Demonstration Day** 2021! This event will be held on **Saturday, June 5th** at the Extension Office. Once registration closes, you will receive an email to sign up for a time slot for your demonstration. This is a new procedure due to COVID.

Start thinking about that demo you've been wanting to do. This is a great opportunity to compete at the county level while fulfilling a requirement for project records! All Demonstration Day registrations will be done on the Carroll County Fair website at www.carrollcountyfair.com. Once registration is open, an email will be sent to all families. Please know that we will be using a new registration system called ShoWorks, so your registration screen will look different this year. Early registration is highly encouraged to prevent any last minute computer malfunctions. Rules and regulations were attached to the December/January *Tribune*. If you have any other questions, call the Extension Office or Superintendents, Jenn Hiscock (443)244 -1633 or Erica McAndrew (410) 967-9399. Registration is now open and will close on May 7th.

Market Swine Weigh-In

Market Swine Weigh-In will take place on Friday, May 7th from 5-9pm. More information will be provided closer to weigh-in dates about COVID precautions and how weigh-in will be conducted. We appreciate everyone's support in following all guidelines. If you have any specific questions about weigh-in, please contact the Extension Office or one of the Swine Committee Members. Please remember to check all of your paperwork prior to leaving weigh-in. Once you leave the Ag. Center, we will not be able to make any changes.

Castration Policy of the Maryland 4-H AnSc Program: All male steers, lambs, pigs and goats must be neutered and healed prior to 4-H weigh-in and tagging. The only exception would be animals that have obvious signs they have been banded, however, their scrotal sac is still intact.

Market Sheep and Goat Weigh-in and Tagging

If you plan to exhibit one of the above animals at the county or state fair, it must have a Maryland 4-H ear tag and be weighed in Carroll County. Livestock registration forms are due by **May 7th for Lambs and Goats and weigh-in will take place on Friday, May 14th, 5-8 pm.** Remember to fill in ALL information, including RFID/Scrapie tag numbers. The Animal Science Code of Ethics will be on the reverse side and BOTH pages must be signed. **Tags cost \$2 for swine, lambs and goats**. Checks can be made payable to CCEAC. You must register, tag and weigh-in the appropriate animal for Carroll County. You may not weigh-in your animals at another county and be eligible for the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. Questions? More information will be provided closer to weigh-in dates about COVID precautions and how each weigh-in will be handled.

Castration Policy of the Maryland 4-H AnSc Program: All male steers, lambs, pigs and goats must be neutered and healed prior to 4-H weigh-in and tagging. The only exception would be animals that have obvious signs they have been banded, however, their scrotal sac is still intact.

Livestock Registration Forms

Livestock registration forms are a 2-page carbon copy form that cannot be printed from home. We mailed registration forms to all 4-H members who submitted 2020 project records for swine, sheep and meat goat projects towards the end of March. If you are a new 4-Her or adding one of the above projects and will need the forms mailed to you, please email Becky at bridgewa@umd.edu with how many forms you will need or stop in and pick them up at the office. Please remember that each species needs to be on their own form.

We will be partnering with the Howard County 4-H Program to offer educational opportunities and chances to exhibit in showmanship, beef/dairy steer classes and breeding heifers. Animal Husbandry Quality Assurance

If you are a new member or have moved to a new age group (Junior to Intermediate, Intermediate to Senior), you are required to take the online Quality Assurance Program this year. The online program is required for ALL 4-H members showing beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats, horses/ponies, poultry, rabbits and alpacas/llamas. When the website is opened by Maryland 4-H, you will need to register and complete this program if you are planning to show at any 4-H show. Livestock/Horse Lease Forms

If you are planning to lease a livestock or horse animal project this year, make sure you complete the 4-H Lease Paperwork. There is a lease agreement that is completed between the 4-H member and the individual leasing the animal to you. Poultry Orientation

For ANYONE who plans to or is thinking about showing poultry at the 2021 Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair, there are several exhibitor meetings scheduled and you are **REQUIRED** to attend "one" of them. **Meeting dates are as follows: Tuesday, May 4th (Poultry Barn), Thursday, May 13th (Poultry Barn), and Wednesday, June 2nd (Poultry Barn). All meetings start at 7 P.M. There will also be an online option for 2021 which you can complete along with a quiz for credit as attending the meeting in person.** Again, you are **REQUIRED** to attend only one in-person meeting or the online video/quiz. Remember, for those 4-Hers who exhibited in 2020, you are required to have turned in a "completed" project record for your poultry project in order to exhibit in 2021. Judging – June 5th – Judging will take place from 2-4:30pm (excluding Clovers) at the Carroll County Extension Office. All participants need to return by 6:30pm for Fashion Show to take place at 7pm in Burns Hall. A signed 4-H Health Pledge will be required of everyone attending and will be emailed out to participants prior to Fashion Revue.

Mini Fashion Revue – Monday, August 2, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. Entries must be completed on line at www.carrollcountyfair.com.

RULES AND REGULATIONS -

- 1. Junior contestants (ages 8 to 10) may model only one outfit. Intermediate members (ages 11 to 13) may model two outfits one from Constructed and one from Ready to Wear. Senior members (ages 14 to 18) may model two outfits, but no more than one outfit per class.
- 2. Participants must participate in both the Preliminary and On-Stage Judging portions of the event.
- 3. Senior champions will represent Carroll County at the Maryland State Fair. Intermediates and Juniors can model only at the Maryland State Fair. 4-H members are responsible for registering themselves into the Maryland State Contest by July 31st at www.marylandstatefair.com
- 4. Each participant will need to arrive between 2-4:30pm on June 5th for modeling/interviewing with the judges. Times will not be assigned and it is the responsibility of the participant to arrive during the judging time listed above.
- 5. All classes except Ready to Wear are constructed by the 4-Her using a sewing machine, hand stitching, weaving, knitting or crocheting. These garments are completed as part of the Sewing/Textiles unit. As in the past, the entire outfit does not have to be home constructed,



unless described as a requirement for the class. Construction is judged only as it affects the appearance of the outfit on the model.

- 6. Ready to Wear classes are garments constructed by a manufacturer. No home-constructed items may be entered in these classes. Garments do not have to be purchased new and can be altered. You are encouraged to follow class descriptions as you select the appropriate class for your entry.
- 7. Accessories do not need to be made by the contestant, but will be taken into consideration in judging the overall presentation of the outfit. Accessories must be easily worn or carried. No live animals or people as accessories.
- 8. No one will be permitted on stage or in the judging room area unless pre-entered in the County Fashion Revue event.
- 9. Age divisions are determined as of January 1 of the current year; Division A–Clover (5-7 years old) Division C–Intermediate (11-13 years old) Division B–Junior (8-10 years old) Division D–Senior (14-18 years old). You must be an enrolled 4-H/Clover member of the Carroll County 4-H Program by May 1st of the current year.
- 10. Two top 13 year olds will be selected by the judges to participate in the State Fashion Revue as an educational opportunity. They will model on stage at State Fashion Revue but will not compete for awards. Thirteen year olds participating at the Maryland State Fair will be identified the evening of the Carroll County 4-H Fashion Revue and is then the responsibility of the 4-H member to enter the state event by July 31st at www.marylandstatefair.com.
- 11. Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in all classes in Senior Division only.
- 12. Intermediate and Junior participants will be judged on the Danish system.
- 13. There will be a Clover division during the County Fashion Revue. Clovers may model a purchased outfit, a handmade outfit, an item handed down, or a decorated outfit. Basically, a clover member may model anything they choose as long as it is appropriate for their age division. Clovers will also be able to participate in Mini Fashion Revue at County Fair. Clover-age participants in both Fashion Revue and Mini Fashion Revue will receive a participation award.
- 14. Any 4-H youth in a sewing/textiles or fashion revue project may participate in State Mini Fashion Revue and Mannequin Modeling by pre-entering on the State Fair website.
