Carroll County 4-H Reopening Update

We are no longer requiring any 4-H meeting/activity to have prior approval and you will not have to fill out the 4-H Health Pledges any more. We are still required to keep an attendance sheet for all 4-H activities and leaders/volunteers leading programs have to complete the post-activity report. All outdoor programs are not required to wear masks, but be aware of social distancing (3 ft. apart). All programs inside still require participants to wear masks.

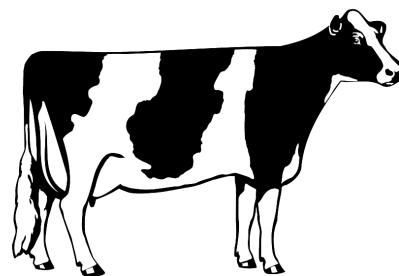

Poultry Judging

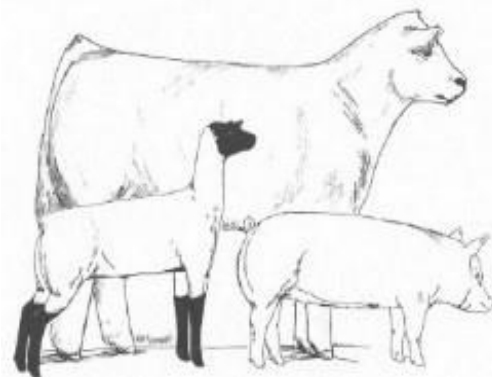

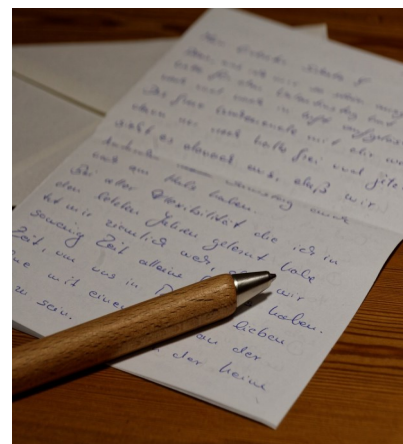
Animal Husbandry Quality Assurance

If you are a new member or have moved to a new age group (Junior to Intermediate, Intermediate to Senior), you are required to take the online Quality Assurance Program this year. The online program is required for ALL 4-H members showing beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats, horses/ponies, poultry, rabbits and alpacas/llamas. When the website is opened by Maryland 4-H, you will need to register and complete this program if you are planning to show at any 4-H show. UME Volunteers

ALL UME Volunteers SHOULD HAVE COMPLETED THEIR ENROLLMENT BY MARCH 1, 2021 on 4-H Online (v2.4online.com). This new deadline is a Maryland 4-H requirement to meet the new background check requirements. Even if you missed the March 1st deadline, we will still work with getting you enrolled! When completing the volunteer enrollment, remember this is a two-step process. Step 1 is the enrollment which leads into step 2, the screening process.

Please note that the state will be approving the screening section of all volunteers once the background checks have been completed and before the county office can approve enrollments. Most volunteers will be considered a Tier 2 volunteer which will consist of a \$15 background check fee completed by a private company. This will be conducted every 3 years.

Some of our volunteers will be considered a Tier 3 volunteer which will consist of a background check along with fingerprinting and will cost around \$55. Volunteers in Tier 3 who work with camp (residential and day camps) or chaperone over night trips with 4-H members will fall under Tier 3.

Children's Day at the Fair

The Fair will, once again, be hosting Children's Day on Tuesday, August 3rd, from 9:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. and we need your help! In previous years, more than 1,100 children have attended this event at the Carroll County Fair, and this success has been due to the participation of 4-H clubs, members, and volunteers!

We are asking that clubs sign up for a make-it and take-it craft table as in the past or to volunteer. The tables or stations can be in 2.5 hours or all day (5 hours) time slots. If your club chooses to sign up for a craft, we ask that you prepare these crafts for either 350 participants (2.5 hour time slot) or 700 participants (all day). When preparing these games and crafts, we ask that you keep agriculture, farming, and 4-H in mind. Remember that these activities should engage our youth and encourage them to stay for the day! If you or your club would like to help with Children's Day, but cannot attend that day, we are also looking for donations! You could provide a monetary donation, a donation for goodie bags, or items such as face paints, crayons, etc.

Foods—CHANGES TO FOOD ENTRIES THIS YEAR!!!

Entries will be drop and go. No conference judging. 4-Hers need to drop their items off Wednesday, **August 4th from 8:30-10am** at the designated areas:

Cookies, Fudge, Breads and Special Needs—Drop off between the garage doors (next to Burns Hall), make sure to place the entry tag on the outside of the bags.

Cakes and Pies—Drop off at the double doors near the red building bathrooms (next to photography department). **Cake disc are available at the Extension Office.**

Decorated Cakes—Drop off in the Extension Office (Rooms A/B). As of right now, masks will be required when entering decorated cakes (Extension Office building policy).

There will be an Inside Bake Sale and a Cake Auction. It may be necessary to wear mask for the Cake Auction. Remember, it's always best practice to wear masks around food entries.

As the fair gets closer, another correspondence about any other changes or things to make it easy to enter your indoor exhibits will be sent out.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I BUY AN ANIMAL?

Once you have purchased an animal, you will be asked to select a processor. The processor is where the animal will be taken to be custom harvested for steaks, chops, ground meat, roasts and cuts made from the animal based on your choosing. Once completed, the processor will contact you to pick up your product. Your final product will be packaged the way you would see it at the grocery store.

WHERE DOES MY MONEY GO?

A majority of the funds will go to kids to help them purchase their next year's projects supplies and feed. No funds pay for salaries; everyone's time is donated. The auction will keep a small portion to help pay for the expenses such as supplies, equipment, etc.

CASH, CHECK OR CREDIT CARD ARE ACCEPTED

HOW DO I TRANSPORT THE ANIMAL THAT I PURCHASED?

The Sale Committee and Volunteers take care of hauling the livestock to the processor, so if you purchase an animal, don't worry about transportation.



CAN I SUPPORT THE YOUTH BUT NOT TAKE THE ANIMAL?

YES! You can purchase an animal, pay for it, and donate the animal back. This means the animal will be resold at a livestock auction and the money will be given to the charity of your choosing. Some suggested charities are listed on the next page.



IS MY PURCHASE TAX DEDUCTIBLE?

In most cases there are tax advantages, but everyone's situation is different.



CAN A COMPANY OR BUSINESS BUY AN ANIMAL?

Businesses are more than welcome to purchase an animal. This is a great way to promote your business or company. Many businesses will have the animal processed and use the meat as gifts for employees, use the meat for employee picnics, etc.

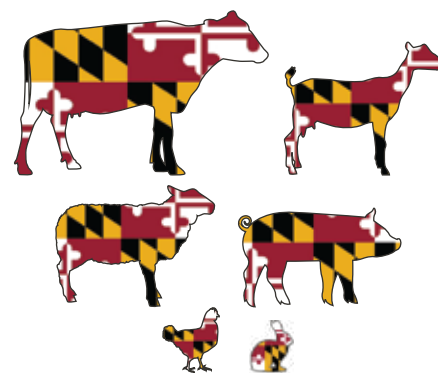

Fashion Revue entries are due by Tuesday, June 1, 2021 unless specified otherwise within department rules.

Judging – June 5th – Judging will take place from 2-4:30pm (excluding Clovers) at the Carroll County Extension Office. All participants need to return by 6:30pm for Fashion Show to take place at 7pm in Burns Hall. **A signed 4-H Health Pledge will be required of everyone attending and will be emailed out to participants prior to Fashion Revue.**

Mini Fashion Revue – Monday, August 2, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. Entries must be completed on line at www.carrollcountyfair.com.

RULES AND REGULATIONS –

1. Junior contestants (ages 8 to 10) may model only one outfit. Intermediate members (ages 11 to 13) may model two outfits – one from Constructed and one from Ready to Wear. Senior members (ages 14 to 18) may model two outfits, but no more than one outfit per class.
2. Participants must participate in both the Preliminary and On-Stage Judging portions of the event.
3. Senior champions will represent Carroll County at the Maryland State Fair. Intermediates and Juniors can model only at the Maryland State Fair. 4-H members are responsible for registering themselves into the Maryland State Contest by July 31st at www.marylandstatefair.com
4. Each participant will need to arrive between 2-4:30pm on June 5th for modeling/ interviewing with the judges. Times will not be assigned and it is the responsibility of the participant to arrive during the judging time listed above.
5. All classes except Ready to Wear are constructed by the 4-Her using a sewing machine, hand stitching, weaving, knitting or crocheting. These garments are completed as part of the Sewing/Textiles unit. As in the past, the entire outfit does not have to be home constructed,

unless described as a requirement for the class. Construction is judged only as it affects the appearance of the outfit on the model.

6. Ready to Wear classes are garments constructed by a manufacturer. No home-constructed items may be entered in these classes. Garments do not have to be purchased new and can be altered. You are encouraged to follow class descriptions as you select the appropriate class for your entry.

7. Accessories do not need to be made by the contestant, but will be taken into consideration in judging the overall presentation of the outfit. Accessories must be easily worn or carried. No live animals or people as accessories.

8. No one will be permitted on stage or in the judging room area unless pre-entered in the County Fashion Revue event.

9. Age divisions are determined as of January 1 of the current year; Division A–Clover (5-7 years old) Division C–Intermediate (11-13 years old) Division B–Junior (8-10 years old) Division D–Senior (14-18 years old). You must be an enrolled 4-H/Clover member of the Carroll County 4-H Program by May 1st of the current year.

10. Two top 13 year olds will be selected by the judges to participate in the State Fashion Revue as an educational opportunity. They will model on stage at State Fashion Revue but will not compete for awards. Thirteen year olds participating at the Maryland State Fair will be identified the evening of the Carroll County 4-H Fashion Revue and is then the responsibility of the 4-H member to enter the state event by July 31st at www.marylandstatefair.com.

11. Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in all classes in Senior Division only.

12. Intermediate and Junior participants will be judged on the Danish system.

13. There will be a Clover division during the County Fashion Revue. Clovers may model a purchased outfit, a handmade outfit, an item handed down, or a decorated outfit. Basically, a clover member may model anything they choose as long as it is appropriate for their age division. Clovers will also be able to participate in Mini Fashion Revue at County Fair. Clover-age participants in both Fashion Revue and Mini Fashion Revue will receive a participation award.

14. Any 4-H youth in a sewing/textiles or fashion revue project may participate in State Mini Fashion Revue and Mannequin Modeling by pre-entering on the State Fair website.

15. Premiums –Junior/Intermediate/Senior - \$4.00 per outfit; Clovers - \$1.00; Fashion Revue Narrator - \$3.00

Carroll County 4-H FASHION REVUE CLASSES:

A. CONSTRUCTED GARMENT MADE AND MODELED BY 4-H MEMBER

- 1. Sports Wear/Lounge Wear**- Outfits include jogging outfits, beach wear, tennis wear, riding habits, ski outfits, skating, or other sports outfits. Lounge wear includes appropriate sleep wear.
- 2. Costumes** - Costumes which are historic, ethnic, or created for theatrical or special events.
- 3. Creative Choice** - Outfits which are knitted, crocheted, or made from fabric that the member has tie-dyed, batiked, handpainted, appliquéd or created by similar methods.
- 4. Re-design** – Outfits created by re-constructing or re-utilizing an existing garment.
- 5. Formal Wear** - Outfit suitable for evening or semi-formal events, including men's wear, long or short dress, skirt or evening pants.
- 6. Business/Professional** – Outfits appropriate for job interviews or professional settings.
- 7. Outer Wear** - Pull-over jackets, short and long coats, rain wear, capes, blazers, and other garments to be worn outdoors but not specifically designed for a particular sport.
- 8. Dresses** – could include a sundress or other non-formal dress.
- 9. Separates** – Jacket, vest, slacks, skirt, blouse, shorts - an outfit appropriate for school or casual affair. (2 or more pieces.)
