Allegheny Co. Fair Horse Show Classes

Class Title	Class Description
1. Senior Grooming & Showmanship	<p>Grooming and Showmanship: Class is judged on the handler's ability to present the horse to the judge in a pattern and on the preparation of the animal for showing. The horse is judged in this class on appearance and responsiveness to handler. Handlers should use the quarter system. Judged 60% on the handler 40% on the horse.</p> <p>Novice for first and second year exhibitors.</p>

5. Senior Halter	<p>Halter: Class is judged on conformation, way of going, quality and soundness of the horse. Horse will be shown at a walk and trot/jog in hand.</p>
6. Intermediate Halter

8. Senior All Day (WT/WJ)	<p>All Day: Class is judged on both the rider and the horse. The rider will be judged on seat, hands, legs and ability to communicate clearly with the horse. Horse will be judged on responsiveness to the rider, manners and way of going. (W/T or W/J)</p>
9. Intermediate All Day (WT/WJ)	
10. Junior All Day (WT/WJ)	
11. English Pleasure (WTC)	<p>Pleasure: Class is judged on the horse's performance, suitability and manners. The horse should be well-balanced in its movement and responsive to the rider. Class is judged 60% on the horse and 40% on the rider. (W/T/C or W/J/L)</p>
12. Western Pleasure (WJL)	
13. English Equitation (WT)	<p>Equitation: Class is judged on the rider including the correctness of their seat, hands, legs and the ability of the rider to communicate clearly with their horse. Riders may be asked to back or perform a sitting trot or posting jog. Judged 60% on the rider and 40% on the horse. (W/T or W/J)</p>
14. Western Equitation (WJ)	
15. Western Riding (WJL)	<p>Western Riding: Following a pattern, the rider and horse will be judged on quality of gait, lead changes at the lope, responsiveness to the rider, manners, and disposition. The horse should perform with reasonable speed at an even free-moving pace.</p>
16. Command Class (WT/WJ)	<p>Command Class. Commands are called to the riders asking for gait changes, halts and changes of direction. The riders/horses in the class are permitted three (3) strides to correctly execute the command, and if they fail to make the change, they are called to the center. The last rider/horse remaining is the winner.</p>
17. Command Class (WTC/WJL)	
18. Hunter Hack (WTC)	<p>Hunter Hack: This class is the beginning of the over-fences classes. This is a combination class in which the horse will jump two (2) low fences and be shown at a W,T,C both ways of the ring on the flat. The horse will be judged on manners and way of going.</p>
19. Hunter Over Fences – 18" Crosses	<p>Hunter Over Fences: Class is judged on the horse's manners, jumping style and way of going. Hunters should clear the fences cleanly and maintain the same cadence throughout the course. This class is not timed.</p>
20. Hunter Over Fences – 24" Verticals	
21. Trail - English or Western (WT/WJ)	<p>Trail: Class is judged on the horse's ability to navigate a series of obstacles that might be encountered on a trail ride or riding outside of a ring. (W/T or W/J)</p>
