COMMUNITY MEMBERS SEIZE OPPORTUNITY TO CAPTURE STORMWATER RUNOFF







University of Maryland Extension Garrett County organized a rain barrel distribution event in May. This free event was made possible because of the financial contribution from the Deep Creek Watershed Foundation, which secured a Keep Maryland Beautiful grant from the

Department of Natural Resources. This grant allowed the purchase of 40 rain barrels and downspout diverters, which were all purchased from a company in Illinois, called Upcycle Products that focus on recycling all materials. The barrels were used for olive oil at one point and the downspout diverters were created from parts of a vinyl fence post. The Foundation also provided manpower and support in countless ways. Before folks could sign up for their free rain barrel, a virtual class was required. There were 60 people that watched the class live and another 79 that have viewed the archived presentation on our YouTube channel. The goal of the program is to help capture stormwater runoff. If you would be interested in receiving a rain barrel in the future, please let us know so that we can work on planning another distribution!

VIRTUAL BRUNCH AND LEARN- BUFFER STRIP, SHORELINE EROSION, AND DOCK DO'S AND DON'TS



The Deep Creek Watershed Foundation is sponsoring a virtual Brunch and Learn talk on July 27th @ 10 am. Mr. Eric Null, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources Manager of Deep Creek Lake Natural Resource Management Area will be discussing shoreline erosion control strategies and best management practices for the buffer strip. The UME Master Gardener Program is proud to offer a multi-county hybrid in-person/online Basic Training program this fall beginning in September 2021. You can apply now!

Virtual classes will be held Wednesday evenings from 6:00 to 9:00 PM, September 1 through November 17, 2021, which will cover the mandatory subjects. In Garrett County, an additional five in-person activities will be held on selected other dates during the training period.

Participating counties include Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Cecil, Dorchester, Garrett, Lower Eastern Shore, Queen Anne's, Prince George's, Talbot, and Washington counties.

The fee to enroll in a Master Gardener Basic Training course differs by county and ranges from \$150.00 to \$300.00. In Garrett County, the fee is \$150 and covers the cost of the mandatory Master Gardener Handbook and additional supplies for the training. Scholarships may be available to offset the fee in select locations.

MARYLAND ROTA PARTNERS WITH ACM AND AHEC WEST TO OFFER NEW PROGRAM



Dr. Stephanie Hutter-Thomas will be facilitating a month-long training curriculum in partnership with AHEC West and Allegany College of Maryland for people in recovery from substance use disorder pursuing certification in Maryland. The curriculum includes a total of 48.5 CEU's approved by the Maryland Addiction & Behavioral -Health Professionals Certification Board (MABPCB). Training topics include Mental Health First Aid, Social Determinants of Health, Stages of Change, Recovery Coach Academy, and Guide to Harm Reduction. Upon completion, all participants will have met all Maryland training requirements needed to apply for the Certified Peer Recovery Specialist (CPRS) examination.
