UPDATES FROM THE 4-H OFFICE





UME's newly implemented Background Check Policy is in full swing! <u>Currently, we are up to the letter</u> <u>"S"</u>. If you are a returning volunteer and your last name begins with A-S and you have not received an invitation, please let us know as soon as possible.

If you plan to chaperone or work with Camp, <u>you will need to be fingerprinted and will not need to complete the online check</u>. Instead you will be contacted by the State 4-H Office and given a code to use at your fingerprinting appointment. We realize this is a big change for all but rest assured it is being implemented for everyone's protection!



Any volunteer that has not re-enrolled in 4-H Online for 2021 must do so ASAP! If you are not enrolled or if your enrollment or screening are incomplete, please log onto 4-H Online: https://v2.4honline.com. Volunteers serving 5+ years will need to complete the Volunteer Refresher Training. If you are required to complete this online refresher, you will receive an email with the link from Marylisa. 


