TEN YEARS OF BUILDING CONFIDENCE AND SAVING MONEY ON HEALTH INSURANCE



This year marks the 10th year anniversary of the Health Insurance Literacy Initiative (HILI) led by University of Maryland Extension. The HILI initiative seeks to reduce confusion and increase confidence in using health insurance. Over the past ten years, 325 people from 33 states, including the District of Columbia, are certified to teach the HILI modules. Over 500 people in the local community participated in the workshops. Topics discussed in the modules include the process of selecting an insurance plan, actions to take when using a

plan, estimating health care costs, disputing a health insurance claim, health care options in your senior years, and health insurance options for farmers and small businesses.
