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2022 4-H Enrollment

ALL 4-H Members, Clovers and UME Volunteers will need to enroll for the 2022 4-H year. You will be able to log into 4-H (v2.4honline.com) to complete your 2022 enrollment. Please note that EVERYONE (4-H MEMBERS, CLOVERS AND UME VOLUNTEERS) will need to log into their family accounts that you have already created and re-enroll each person listed on your account. DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT – LOG IN USING YOUR EMAIL AND PASSWORD. If you have forgotten your password, there is an option to restore your password.

ALL 4-H MEMBERS AND CLOVERS MUST PAY THEIR \$10 PARTICIPATION FEE THROUGH 4-H ONLINE. UME Volunteers do not pay a participation fee. The insurance fee that 4-H Members, Clovers and UME Volunteers pay will still be paid through your 4-H Club.

Remember you must be enrolled into the Carroll County 4-H Program by May 1, 2022 to be eligible to show at the 2022 Carroll County 4-H/ FFA Fair or to be recognized as a UME Volunteer. If you have any questions, please call the Extension Office at 410-386-2760.

Livestock Sale Update

ALL 2022 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale Exhibitors are responsible for transporting their 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale project to the processor of their buyers choosing. Please read the attached information carefully (you will sign a carbon copy form at weigh-in or when you submit livestock registration forms). All exhibitors will be required to sign and return the following form if they intend to sell in the 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale. In addition, the Livestock Sale Committee voted to decrease our commission from the original 6% to 5%. Hopefully this will help exhibitors offset transportation costs to processors. Finally, beginning this year, the CC 4-H & FFA Livestock sale will start at 4:30pm. Scholarship awards will start at 3:30pm. The buyers picnic will run from 5-7pm. Weigh-in has been rescheduled for **Saturday, February 12th from 8am-11am at the Ag Center (TRP Barn).** Please remember to come up the main entrance to the Ag Center. All families who turned in live-stock registration forms should have received an email with the rescheduled information on January 12th. Remember, you will be asked at weigh-in to sign the Commitment to Deliver Livestock Sale Animal to Processor Form.

NEW DAIRY/BEEF STEER CLASS

A new division will be added into the Dairy Steer Show for the 2022 Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. This class will be a dairy/beef crossbred class. Those exhibitors that have been showing dairy/beef crosses will now be eligible for this new division in the Dairy Steer Department. UME Volunteers

When completing the volunteer enrollment, remember this is a two-step process. Step 1 is the enrollment which leads into step 2, the screening process.

Please note that the state will be approving the screening section of all volunteers once the background checks have been completed and before the county office can approve enrollments. Please make sure to meet the March 1st deadline of completing your enrollment to be covered under the Maryland Tort Claims Act which provides you coverage (if ever needed) as a UME Volunteer.

Also, we are required by UME/Maryland 4-H volunteer policies to have volunteer position descriptions signed every 3 years. Many volunteers will need to resign their position descriptions. Be on the lookout in your mail and return to the Extension Office to ensure that we have all your information up to date in the office.

By signing, both Parent/Guardian and the 4-H & FFA Exhibitor agree to the following terms & conditions regarding the 4-H Livestock Project you intend to sell in the Carroll County Livestock Sale:

- The Exhibitor will be required to take their animal home following the Livestock Sale. At which point the Exhibitor will be liable for transportation and care for the animal following the Quality Assurance Guidelines once it is released from the Sale Barn. This includes committing to caring for and providing shelter, feed, and water to this sold 4-H & FFA Livestock project during the timeframe it is to be housed in your care. The Exhibitor will be responsible to produce the well taken care of animal to the proper processor (Chosen by the Buyer) at the proper given time specified by the Livestock Sale Committee. The Carroll County 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale Committee will not be responsible or liable for transporting any livestock to destinations.
- If you intend to offer your Livestock Sale Buyer a processing spot that you have privately set up, please notify the Livestock Sale Committee as soon as possible at sale@carrollcountyfair.com.
- Beef, Goats and Sheep sold in the 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale will begin being released at 10pm or at the conclusion of the Beef section of the Sale, whichever comes first, on the Friday night of the 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale. Exhibitors have until 1 hour following the conclusion of the 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale to remove these animals. All remaining animals including all swine will be released on the Saturday following the 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale between the hours of 6am and 9am. No animal leaves the barn until you have checked out with an appointed Livestock Sale Representative.


