



4-H Public Speaking Contest Information

There will be a public speaking workshop on **March 4, 2022 from 6:30 – 8:30** to help you prepare for the contest. To register for the workshop please contact the 4-H office at 410-638-3255 by February 25.

The 4-H program is well known for developing strong leaders through hands-on experiences. Of all the leadership and life skills learned in 4-H one of the most important skills is public speaking. Whether it is talking to a judge in the show ring, leading a business meeting, or just introducing yourself at a club meeting you are practicing one of the most important skills that will help you for your entire life. In every day life all of us will find ourselves in a situation where public speaking skills are important, despite how common public speaking is research has shown that it is also one of the most common fears. One of the best ways to overcome the fear of public speaking is to practice your public speaking skills as often as you can.

Maryland 4-H offers opportunities to practice and compete in public speaking in several categories; prepared speech, extemporaneous speech, radio spot, and interpretation. Harford County 4-H offers all of these plus opportunities for our Clover and Junior members to recite the pledge. Clovers may also choose to do show and tell or use their favorite book. Duo interpretation is also available to all ages at the Harford County contest.

To help you choose the category that is right for you here is a brief description of the four offered at the state and county level:

<u>Prepared speech:</u> This speech is written prior to the contest on any topic that interests the youth. The speech should focus on a specific topic and include research. Contestants may have note cards with them but cannot read from a script (with the exception of juniors). The speech should be practiced but not memorized.

<u>Extemporaneous speech</u>: This speech is not pre-written. The contestants will draw a random topic at the competition. After drawing a topic, they will be given time to prepare their thoughts and create an outline on note cards.

<u>Radio Spot:</u> This is a 30 second speech that promotes 4-H in some way. Contestants may use sound effects. The total time cannot exceed 30 seconds. This would be a piece that could be recorded for use as a radio station advertisement. A script must be provided to the judge.

<u>Interpretations:</u> An Interpretation is a memorized oral presentation of a selected narrative from published script of a television show, book, play, or any unpublished source. Costumes may be worn to enhance the interpretation. Copies of the original script with reference citations must be provided to the judges.

County winners in these three categories (in each age division) will have the opportunity to represent Harford County at the State 4-H Public Speaking contest on April 23, 2022 in Carroll County.


