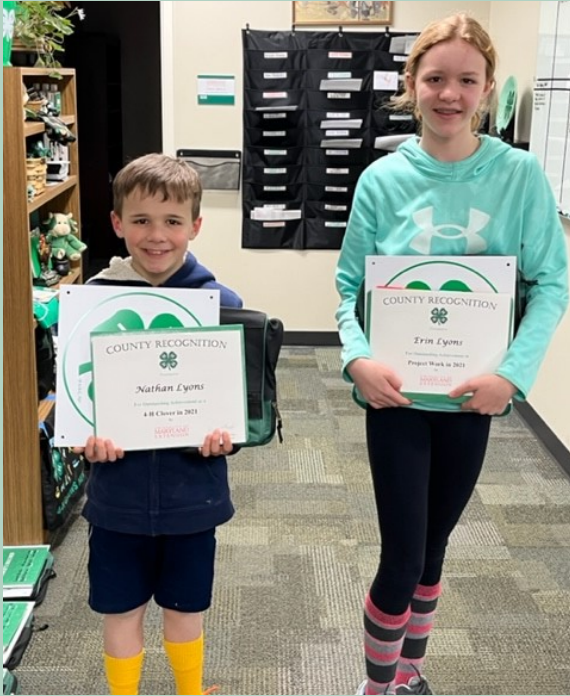

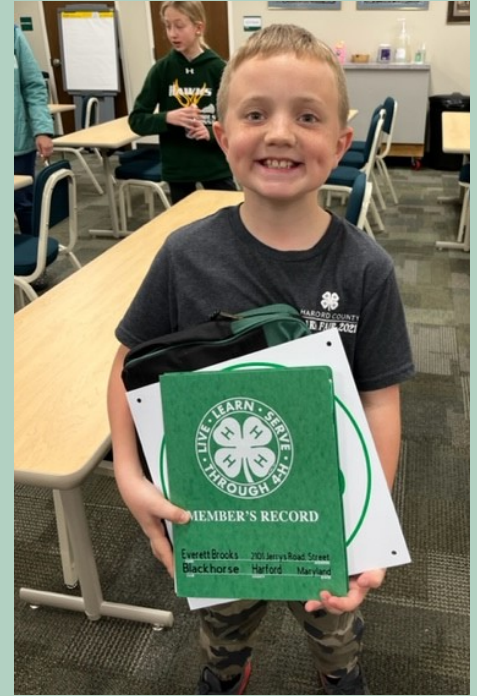
Record Book Award Winners!

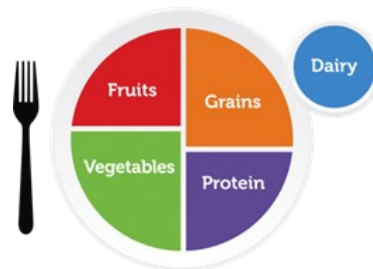

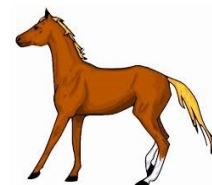

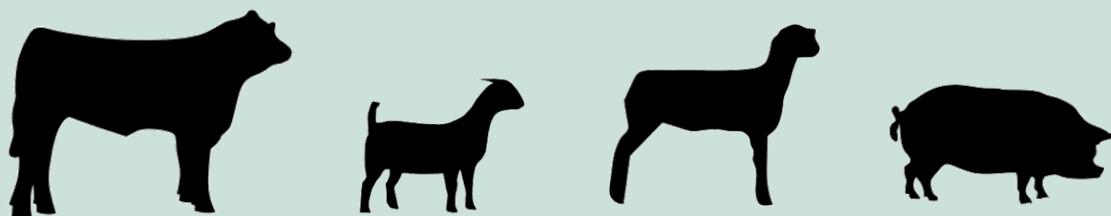

2022 Essay Topic:

Transportation: Minimizing Stress on Bees While Getting Them Where They Need to Be

Each year, approximately 1.5 million honey bee colonies make the trip to California to pollinate almonds, mostly via large trucks. The movement of these colonies, along with another half million colonies based in California, constitute the largest insect migration event in the world (albeit assisted migration). Many beekeepers often need to move colonies to various apiary locations, or for local pollination, etc. What are the major stresses on bees during local and long-distance transportation?

In your essay, please give specific examples for how those stresses can be minimized when moving colonies within an apiary, during short-distance movement among local apiaries, and during long-distance movement across state lines. Writers are encouraged to include photos and interviews with commercial beekeepers, citing state laws for the transport of bees.

Eligibility: The 2022 National 4-H Beekeeping Essay Competition is open to active 4-H members only.

Any 4-H Club member who placed first, second or third in previous years of the national competition is NOT eligible to win in 2022; however, state competition winners remain eligible to enter the national competition. MD Dairy Princess

The Maryland dairy industry is looking for young women to promote Maryland's official beverage - MILK! Dairy Princess candidates must be between the ages of 16 and 22 and Dairy Maids must be between the ages of 13 and 16. All candidates must be Maryland residents.

Candidates must be the owner or leaser of at least one dairy animal and/or enrolled in a dairy related project through 4-H or FFA for two years. Accepted dairy projects are "4-H Healthy Living" foods project with an emphasis in dairy foods, dairy leasing program, dairy judging, FFA Milk Quality and Products CDE or FFA Dairy Handling CDE. Candidates may also be employed herself or the daughter of a dairy farm manager or herdsman; or an employee in a dairy related industry (farm store, cooperative, DHIA, feed supplier, veterinarian, milk inspector, etc.) **Because this program is funded by the dairy cattle milk check-off, dairy goats and dairy steers are not acceptable project areas.**

Princess candidates will compete in regional contests held in May. Harford County is in the Upper Chesapeake Region. The seven Regional Princesses will compete in the state pageant in July. The regional winners will work together throughout their reign to spread the good news about dairy to consumers across the state. There are no local or state competitions for Dairy Maids - they will all receive a sash and will be introduced during the state pageant. 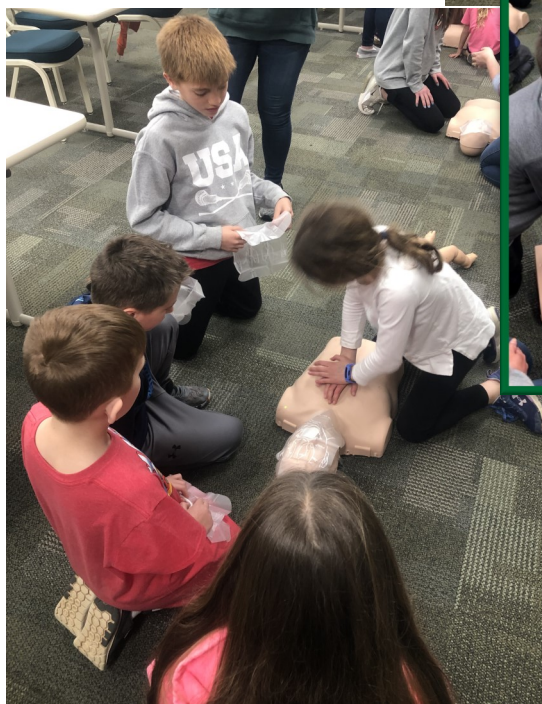

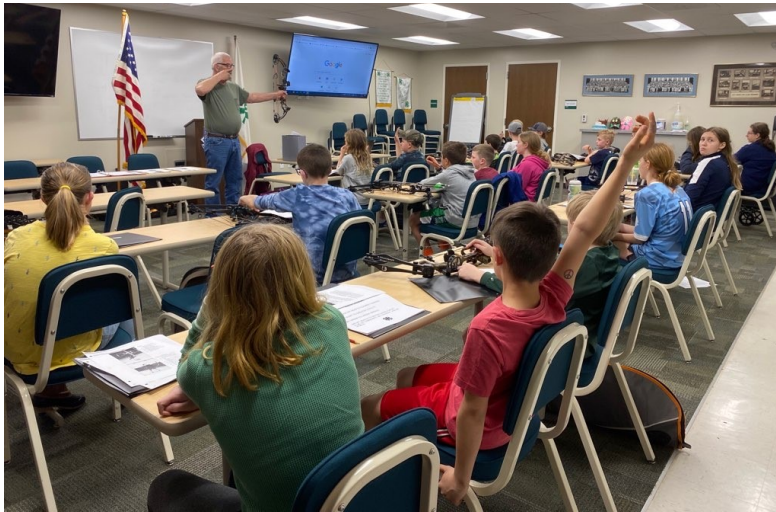

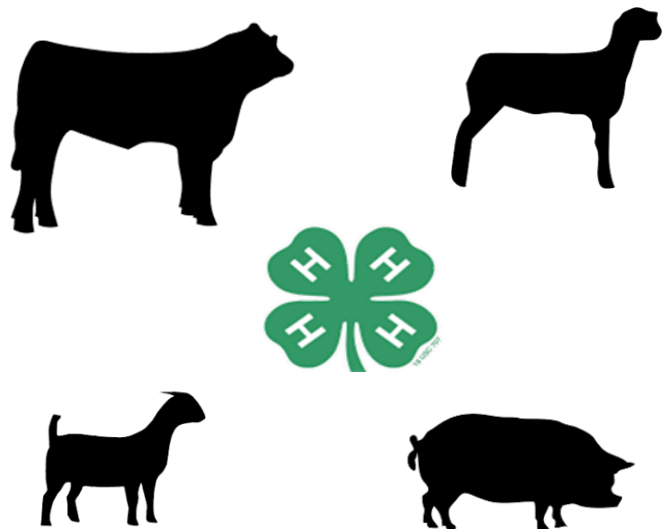
