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CC 4-H & FFA Fair Reminders

We are closing in on our favorite week of the year! The 2022 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair! Take time before fair week arrives to go through the schedule for all of the set-up times, entry times and events so your families are prepared beforehand. Double check all of the rules including the fair general rules and individual department rules that 4-Hers in your household are preparing for. Remember the fair relies on volunteers and EVERYONE'S help is needed for set-up, working food concessions/events throughout the week and clean-up afterwards.

Here are some important dates to put in your calendars to help with set-up and clean-up of the fairgrounds:

Fair Grounds Set-Up—Sunday, July 24th starting at 8am
Fair Grounds Clean-up—Saturday, August 6th starting at 9am and
Sunday, August 7th at 9am

This is a great way for 4-H members to gain service hours to meet CCPS requirements too!

Exhibitor Packet/Parking Pass Pick-Up Reminders—Don't forget that ALL exhibitors MUST sign the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair Liability Release Form, which also needs to be signed by your parent/guardian.

ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITORS need to sign the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair Code of Animal Ethics form. This is different from what you signed for weigh-in.

And, **ALL MARKET LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS** must complete the Feed Assurance Form.

Red Building Fair Reminders

Now is a good time to get prepared for the 125th Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair! Read the rules for each department you will be entering where you will find all of the information about entering your project(s). If you have specific questions, you will also find the contact information for the department superintendents. Next, check your fair schedule at www.carrollcountyfair.com to see when your exhibits are being entered. This year, some departments will have "drop and go" entries, where you will drop off your project and it will be judged at a later time. Other departments will say "entered and judged" on the schedule. These departments will have conference judging and you will be able to talk to the judges about your project.

Enter these departments on Thursday, July 28th—Booths and Banners, Club Books, Club Shoe Box Floats, Service-Learning Exhibits (judged at entry time), Crafts (judged at entry time), Plants and Flowers, Garden Products, Art and General Exhibits (judged at entry time)

Enter these departments on Friday, July 29th—Engineering & Technology (judged at entry time), Photography, Shoe Box Floats (judged at entry time), Mechanical Arts (judged at entry time), Silk & Dried Flowers, Lost Arts (judged at entry time), Clothing (judged at entry time), Home Environment and Family Life

Enter these departments on Saturday, July 30th—Woodworking (judged at entry time), Canning (judged at entry time), Ag Commodities, Clover Exhibits (judged at entry time), and Natural Resources (judged at entry time)

Small Pets entered and judged on Sunday, July 31st.

Foods Department (except Canning) will be entered on Wednesday, August 2nd and will have conference judging this year. Cake discs are available at the Extension Office. New this year, you will be able to pick up the cake domes, so you will not need to transfer your cakes or pies at the fair. Please be realistic in the number of cake domes you take as they are expensive!

Livestock Sale Update

ALL 2022 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale Exhibitors are responsible for transporting their 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale project to the processor of their buyer's choosing. Please read the attached information carefully (you signed a carbon copy form at weigh-in or when you submitted livestock registration forms). All exhibitors will be required to sign and return the form if they intend to sell in the CC 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale. In addition, the Livestock Sale Committee voted to decrease their commission from the original 6% to 5%. Hopefully, this will help exhibitors offset transportation costs to processors. Finally, beginning this year, the CC 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale will start at 4:30pm. The buyers' picnic will run from 4-6pm. If you are a new member or have moved to a new age group (Junior to Intermediate, Intermediate to Senior), you are required to take the online Quality Assurance Program this year. The online program is required for ALL 4-H members showing beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats, horses/ponies, poultry, rabbits and alpacas/llamas. 



Project Record—2022 Update of Requirement

In 2022, all project records that are completed will be held to meetiall standards, including the communication section. Remember, that 4-Hers must present a speech or demonstration to 3 or more people not related to them to meet this requirement. *This is a speech or demonstration the youth has given, not something they attended.* Don't forgot that participating in programs such as skillathon, bowls, and judging programs count toward this requirement. The Extension Office has been lenient of this project record requirement since 2020, but with clubs and programs happening again in-person, all project records submitted MUST have a communication piece. Maryland Park Service Youth Group Pass

The office now has a Maryland Park Service Youth-Group Pass available for check-out! Call the office to learn more!

The Maryland Park Service Youth-group Pass allows free day-use entry into Maryland state parks. The pass also entitles youth groups to camp in those parks that have designated youth group areas, subject to site availability. In order to camp, all groups must have a valid Maryland Park Service Youth-group Pass and must make a reservation.

A few things to be aware of:

- Usage excludes weekends and holidays from Memorial Day through Labor Day.
- Maryland Park Service reserves the right to restrict the maximum number of vehicles and individuals admitted under one Youth-group pass per visit.
- A minimum ratio of one adult supervisor for every five youth is required (may be waived by the facility manager).
- The minimum allowed age of group members is 6 years old and the maximum allowed age of group members is 18 years old.
- Family members that are accompanying the group, but not part of the leadership of the group, may be subject to additional service charges.
- Service charges for special facilities such as shelters, boat concessions, reservations and special events are not covered by the youth pass.

UME Volunteers

When completing your volunteer enrollment, remember this is a two-step process. Step 1 is the enrollment which leads into step 2, the screening process.

Please note that the state will be approving the screening section of all volunteers once the background checks have been completed and before the county office can approve enrollments. There was a March 1st deadline of completing your re-enrollment to be covered under the Maryland Tort Claims Act which provides you coverage (if ever needed) as a UME Volunteer.

Also, we are required by UME/Maryland 4-H volunteer policies to have volunteer position descriptions signed every 3 years. Many volunteers will need to sign their position descriptions again. Be on the lookout in your mail and return to the Extension Office to ensure that we have all your information up to date in the office.

Code of Animal Science Ethics

Participants enrolled in animal science projects (e.g., beef, camelids, dairy, dog, goat, horse, poultry, rabbit, sheep, small pet, and swine) shall, at all times, conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship, including while with their projects and at all animal science activities and events. Their conduct should always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of 4-H and its animal science program. Participants, as well as parents, volunteers and others working with them, are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts; and their conduct and values must serve as a positive influence on others.

This Code of Ethics applies to all Participating members who are enrolled in animal science projects, and to others (exhibitors, parents, volunteers, owners, etc.) who participate in the animal science program; and it covers daily animal care, as well as participation in competition and other 4-H animal activities and events.

Fair Exhibitors and others who violate this Code of Ethics demean the integrity of Fair and its animal science program. Exhibitors who violate the code of animal science ethics are subject to sanctions including, but not limited to, forfeiture of premiums, awards, and/or auction proceeds and may be prohibited from participation in Fair or 4-H/UME events or activities; other violators may also be subject to sanction, as appropriate. Infractions may be reviewed by 4-H and/or UME (on the local or state level, as appropriate to the infraction and to the event and/or activity in question), and/or may be subject to a fair oversight committee or other entity that oversees an activity or event. In addition, some acts may also be subject to review based upon the Maryland 4-H Youth Code of Conduct and/or other UME policies.

The following is a list of standards and requirements for all Fair animal science projects, at all times, whether at home, at animal exhibitions or events, or any other 4-H event or activity.

- 1. The care of all fair project animals is the responsibility of the Exhibitors. Exhibitors must properly care for and groom their animals for the duration of their project.
- 2. All project animals must be housed at the Exhibitor's residence unless a different location is submitted to and approved in writing by the local fair staff. Any change in location must be approved in writing by the local fair staff; however, it is not necessary to report direct transport to and from shows or other events.

- 3. Upon request of fair, or other program, event or animal officials, Exhibitors must present proof of ownership, length of ownership, identity and/or age of all fair project animals owned or leased. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or identity of animal, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited. If a fair project animal is sold in a livestock sale, it is no longer eligible to be shown in a 4-H event in Maryland in that year.
- 4. Exhibitors must provide appropriate animal health certificates upon request of fair, or other program, event or animal officials.
- 5. Fair project animals must be presented to competition, activities and/or events, where they will enter the food chain, free of volatile drug residues. Animals which are presented to competition, events and/or activities that do not culminate with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and rules. Fair project animals shall not be exhibited if drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations and rules may affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. At any time after an animal arrives on a fair or other activity or event premises, a licensed veterinarian must administer or, in consultation with fair, event, or officials, direct the administration of any treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications. Drenching at any time after an animal arrives on a fair or other activity or event premises is prohibited, except when performed or directed by a licensed veterinarian in consultation with fair, event, State officials for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal.
- 6. The act of enrolling in a fair animal science project, and/or entering a project animal in a fair competition, show, activity, or other event, gives consent for fair or event authorities to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, hair, tissue, or other substance from the animal to be used for testing purposes including, but not limited to, drugs or identification. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved, and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the project owner to prove otherwise at any review in regard to the matter conducted by a fair or other event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, hair, tissue or other sample, taken from a fair animal science project, indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally.
- 7. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counter irritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 8. Using ice, ice packs, cold packs, or cold compresses, internally or externally, other than those prescribed to relieve heat stress or a medical condition as diagnosed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 9. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices, such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical devices, or other similar practices, are not acceptable and are prohibited.

- 10. All judges, fair, event officials and volunteers shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect, and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them or toward exhibitors or others participating in the activity. In addition, direct criticism or interference with a judge, fair, show or event official, exhibitor, breed representative, fair staff or volunteer before, during, or after an event or other activity is prohibited.
- 11. No one shall violate this Code of Animal Science Ethics or conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this Code of Ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this Code of Ethics.
- 12. The application of this Code of Ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition to the exhibitor whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this Code of Ethics.

Note: By signing this form the Exhibitor and his/her parent or guardian each verify that they have read and understand the **Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair, INC Code of Animal Science Ethics** and the consequences of and penalties provided for violations of the Code.

2022 Carroll Co. 4-H & FFA Livestock Exhibitor Feed Assurance Documentation

What is BSE? Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE), also known as Mad Cow Disease, is a form of disease that is progressively degenerative to the central nervous system and is fatal. This disease affects ruminant animals.

Ruminant animals are defined as any animals that have a four-chambered stomach; Ruminant animals sold in our sale include cattle, sheep, and goats. Hogs, chickens and rabbits are NOT ruminant animals.

Feeding ruminants protein that comes from potentially contaminated tissues may transmit BSE.

The United States has taken measures to help reduce the risk of American animals contracting the disease. The United States Food and Drug Administration adopted a regulation in 1997 that would prohibit ruminant animal feeds from containing any protein sources that came from ruminant animal tissues. For example, a cattle feed could not have a protein source that came from sheep.

FDA Regulation 21 CFR 589.2000 states that animal proteins are prohibited in ruminant feeds. The FDA defines animal's proteins as "any protein containing portions of mammalian animals.

EXCLUDING: blood and blood products; gelatin; inspected meat products which have been cooked and offered for human food and further processed for feed (such as plate waste and used cellulose food casings); milk products, and any product whose only mammalian protein consists entirely of porcine or equine protein." A full copy of the regulation is on file at the Extension Office.

Because of this regulation, commercial feed suppliers do not include the prohibited ingredients in their prepared mixes. It is important that you do pay attention to feed labels and feed only those feeds that have been missed for that species to that species. Example: hog feeds should not be fed to cattle, sheep, or goats.

Because BSE has been in the news recently, livestock producers need to do everything possible to reassure the public consumers that all steps are being taken to keep our meat supply safe.

A number of packers and processors, as well as retail operations, have established certification programs to ensure that they are receiving animals that have been properly fed and cared for. They have made it clear that they will not accept or purchase any ruminant animals that have been fed any feed containing protein from ruminant animal tissues, or any animals that have illegal levels of drug residues.

What does it mean to you? As a 4-H or FFA project member, you will need to sign, along with your parent or guardian, the certificate of Feed Assurance Quality for your sale animals agreeing that your ruminate animals (cattle, sheep and goats) have not been fed proteins derived from ruminant animal tissue, and that none of your animals (cattle, sheep, goats, hogs, market rabbits, capons) sold will have illegal levels of drug residue. This simply puts into writing the management practices you should be following throughout your project.

If we do not have this form on filed, you will not be permitted to sell your animals(s) in the Livestock Sale. This form will help us to assure our buyers and the consumers that you are doing everything you can do to bring them a safe, quality product and could also help you to get a better price for your animal.
