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2023 Enrollment

ALL 4-H Members, Clovers and UME Volunteers will need to enroll for the 2023 4-H year. You will be able to log into 4-H (v2.4honline.com) to complete your 2023 enrollment. Please note that EVERYONE returning (4-H MEMBERS, CLOVERS AND UME VOLUNTEERS) will need to log into their family account that you have already created and re-enroll each person listed on your account. DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT – LOG IN USING YOUR EMAIL AND PASSWORD. If you have forgotten your password, there is an option to restore your password.

ALL 4-H MEMBERS AND CLOVERS MUST PAY THEIR \$10 PARTICIPATION FEE THROUGH 4-H ONLINE. UME Volunteers do not pay a participation fee. The insurance fee that 4-H Members, Clovers and UME Volunteers pay will still be paid through your 4-H Club in early spring.

Remember you must be enrolled into the Carroll County 4-H Program by May 1, 2023 to be eligible to show at the 2023 Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. UME Volunteers need to enroll by March 1st!! If you have any questions, please call the Extension Office at 410-386-2760.

Demonstration Day!

It's time to start thinking about Demonstration Day 2023! This event will be held on **Saturday**, **February 18**, **2023** at the Extension Office. Arrive between 9 and 11am. Demonstrations will be given on a first come first serve basis. Start thinking about that demonstration you've been wanting to do. This is a great opportunity to compete at the county level while fulfilling a requirement for project records! All **Demonstration Day registrations will be done through the Carroll County Fair website at www.carrollcountyfair.com. Registration will be open from January 9 through February 10, 2023. Project Records

4-H Expectations

As you take time at the beginning of the year to work on your 4-H enrollment, please take a few minutes to review several forms and documents that you are signing when you enroll in 4-H or have voted on within your clubs. We've been hearing that it's been awhile since some of our 4-H families have been seen attending their local club meetings, some families are not receiving information and there have been some behavior issues (especially during the fair).

Club Attendance – Each club has By-Laws which are voted on by the membership. These By-Laws have attendance policies set in them and many state that if a 4-Her misses more than 3 consecutive meetings, they may be removed from the club. This could lead to not being able to participate at the fair if you're not attending club meetings. Make sure to attend the monthly meetings as it's an important part of being a 4-Her, but also a great way to be involved and know what is happening within the program.

Youth Code of Conduct – This is a set of guidelines that outlines the expectations of behavior at 4-H events.

A copy was attached to the December/January *Tribune*. We hope families will take a few minutes to read through the Code of Conduct. This document is electronically signed by the 4-Her and the parent/guardian at the time of 4-H re/enrollment.

Project Related Consents/Ethics – As you also sign up for your individual projects in 4-H Online, take notice that there are consents that you are signing. Most of these are related to animal science projects, but the shooting sports program also has additional consents that are signed.

Please take the time to review what you are signing and what the expectations are for 4-Hers.

Public Speaking

Prepare your speaking voices for the annual day of Public Speaking scheduled for Saturday, March 11th beginning at 9am. Rules and Regulations will be in this *Tribune* and can be found on the fair website.

Registration will open on January 9th and MUST be completed by February 10th. The procedure will be the same as past years, no pre-scheduled times, but you must be present between 9 and 11am to deliver your speech. You must go to www.carrollcountyfair.com and complete registration through the fair entry system.

Record Books

Record books are a great way to keep track of your 4-H career and highlight your accomplishments. Poultry Orientation

If you plan to OR are thinking about entering in the Poultry department at the 2023 fair, you will need to attend one of the orientations scheduled for Tuesday, March 14, Wednesday, April 5 and Thursday, May 4th. All meetings start at 7pm at the Extension Office. You need to attend if you think you are going to show eggs, a poster, and if you are a clover. This includes first year exhibitors or returning exhibitors. These orientations will explain entering, knowing what breed you have, expectations of you during fair week, what to expect from the poultry committee during fair week and the ever-changing fair schedule. It is nearly certain that there will be lots of changes in the schedule for this year. If you showed in the Poultry department in 2022, you are required to have completed a Poultry Project Record in order to exhibit in the 2023 fair (clovers exempt). There will not be ANY make up orientations and there will not be ANY online opportunities to complete the orientation. Please do not put off attending an orientation.
