The Cloverettes and Friends 4-H Club made HomemadeFried Rice for the Meal Appeal Contest. They were our Mixed Age Group Champions!

Homemade Fried Rice

2 T. unsalted butter, divided 3/4 C fresh or frozen peas

3 large eggs, lightly beaten 3/4 C shredded carrots

1 large bell pepper, diced 2 cloves of garlic, minced

2 1/2 cups of COLD cooked brown rice 1/2 C green onions, chopped

1 T low sodium soy sauce Sprigs of parsley

5 T canola oil Crushed red pepper flakes

Place the 1/2 T butter in a frying pan over medium heat. Add the eggs, stir with a spatula until they start to set, scramble and break into bite size pieces. Cook eggs thoroughly. Transfer into a small bowl and set aside. Add 1 T of canola oil to the pan and add peppers. Cook until crisp but tender. Whisk together the soy sauce and remaining canola oil, set aside. Add 1 1/2 T butter to the skillet. Stir in peas and carrots, stirring constantly to cook evenly. Add the minced garlic. Next, add the rice and soy sauce mixture. Continue cooking, stirring constantly, breaking up any clumps of rice until heated through, about 3 minutes. Add eggs and onions. Cool and stir until thoroughly heated, about 1 minute. Sprinkle with parsley and red pepper flakes. Serves 6



The Churchville Champions made Orange Lovers Cake for the Meal Appeal Contest.

Their team was our Mixed Age Group Reserve Champions!

Orange Lover's Cake

1 large orange 1 1/3 C sugar (divided)

1 C raisins 1/2 C cooking oil

1/3 C walnuts 1 C milk

2 C sifted flour 2 eggs

1 t baking soda 1 t cinnamon

1 t salt

Directions: Squeeze the juice from the orange, reserving juice. Grind orange pulp, rind, raisins and walnuts together. Sift flour, baking soda, salt and 1 C of sugar together. Add milk and oil, mix well. Bet eggs and stir into batter. Fold in ground mixture. Pour batter into a greased and lightly floured 12X8X2 pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes. Pour reserved juice over warm cake. Combine remaining sugar and cinnamon, sprinkle over cake. ***We liked it best when it sat overnight!***



The Black Horse 4-H Club prepared Waffles for the Meal Appeal Contest. Their Mixed Age Team placed second!

Waffles with Whipped Cream

2 1/2 C flour 1 T vanilla yogurt

1/2 t salt 1 t honey

4 t baking powder 1/3 C oil

1 T sugar Whipped Cream:

2 eggs 1/2 carton of heavy cream

1 3/4 C milk 1 T powdered sugar

1 t vanilla 1 t vanilla

Preheat your waffle iron. Combine all of the dry ingredients in a bowl. Whisk together the eggs, milk, yogurt, honey, vanilla and oil in a separate bowl. Carefully combine your wet ingredients to your dry ingredients. Stir until blended, a few lumps in the batter is okay. Spray your waffle iron with non stick cooking spray. Add batter and cook according to manufacturer's directions. In another bowl, beat together all of the whipped cream ingredients until stiff peaks form. Top your waffles with whipped cream and enjoy!



The Clover Community 4-H Club prepared Chicken Fried Rice for the Meal Appeal Contest. Their Mixed Age Team placed third!

Chicken Fried Rice

2 T sesame oil
2-3 garlic cloves
2 T canola oil
3 large eggs
1 pound chicken breast
4 C cooked rice

1 1/2 C frozen peas and carrots 3-4 T soy sauce

3 green onions 3 mandarin oranges, peeled and segmented

Add 1 T canola oil to a skillet and cook chicken thoroughly. Set chicken aside on a plate. Next, whisk eggs and add to the skillet. Cook thoroughly and break into bite size pieces. Set aside. Add remaining canola oil, and frozen peas and carrots. Next add garlic and rice, stirring constantly. Add the chicken, eggs, and sesame oil. Heat thoroughly. Last, add chopped green onions and orange segments. Drizzle with soy sauce before serving.



The Paws and Claws 4-H Club prepared Sesame Chicken and potatoes for the Meal Appeal Contest. Their Junior Team placed Champion!

Honey Sesame Chicken with Potatoes

2 T butter 3/4 t garlic powder

1 T avocado oil 3 T honey

3 oz chicken breast, cut into small pieces 8-10 drops of sesame oil

4 small potatoes 1/4 C shaved carrots

Salt and Pepper 1/2 t sesame seeds

Add butter and oil to a skillet over medium heat. Add chicken breast and cook until no longer pink and thoroughly cooked. Cut potatoes into bite size pieces. Add to skillet. Season with salt and pepper. Stir constantly. Add garlic powder, honey and sesame oil. Peel carrots and shave using vegetable peeler. Add to pan. Continue to cook until vegetables are tender and chicken reaches 165 degrees. Garnish with sesame seeds before serving.

Sugar Cookie Bars with Frosting

1 1/4 C sugar

3/4 C salted butter, softened

8 oz cream cheese, softened

1 egg

1 T vanilla extract

1 t almond extract

1 3/4 C flour

1 t baking soda

1 t baking powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine sugar, butter, cream cheese and egg. Beat one minute on medium speed. Add extracts, beat one minute. In a separate bowl, combine flour, baking soda and baking powder. Add to wet ingredients. Beat 2-3 minutes on medium speed. Place batter in a 9X13 baking dish lined with parchment. (Tip: oil hands to prevent dough from sticking to them and press batter into dish) Bake for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Allow to cool and frost.

Frosting recipe: Combine 3 1/2 cups of powdered sugar and 1/2 salted softened butter. Next, beat in milk, a tablespoon at time and extracts. You may add food coloring to tint the icing. Beat until smooth and spreadable. Frost cookie bars and add sprinkles, if desired.
