4-H PUBLIC SPEAKING RESULTS



The Garrett County Public Speaking Contest was held on Thursday, March 16th at the Extension Office. Presentations by the youth, ages 8 to 18, were provided in six categories which included the following:

- Radio Spot speakers provided a 30-second speech to promote 4-H participation.
- Prepared speakers prepared a speech of 3-6 minutes on any subject and practiced prior to the event.
- Extemporaneous speakers selected a topic at the site, and they then had 15-30 minutes to plan and present their speech.
- Interpretation speakers provided a presentation that was dramatic and humorous.

- Demonstration speakers showed a step-by-step how to do or make something in 3-15 minutes.
- Visual Presentation speakers prepared a 3-6 minute speech using props to illustrate and accentuate the presentation.

The judges for the event were Janet Tichnell and Marvin Beckman.

All 4-H members named as champions are eligible to participate in the State Public Speaking contest that will be held on April 29th at the University of Maryland, College Park.
