The online program is required for ALL 4-H members showing beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats, horses/ponies, poultry, rabbits and alpacas/llamas. ### **Indoor Building Updates:**

This month, I will cover the **Foods Department**. The biggest change for this department is Division 105. The name has been changed to "Baking for Specialty Diets" as it was previously called "Baking for Special Needs." The new name clarifies what and who the 4-Her is baking for. Our Cookie of the Year is the Thumbprint Cookie. The Cake of the Year is the Apple Streusel Cake.

Now is the time to get your recipes together and practice baking the items you want to enter in the fair, so by August 2nd (entry day) you will have mastered them. Cake discs will be available June 1st at the Extension Office. Discs and cake domes will be available at packet pick up and afterwards, too. We should have 2 sizes of domes. The larger domes are for higher cakes that are layered. Other cakes will most likely fit in shorter domes. By picking up the domes early you will not need to transfer your cakes or pies at the fair. Please be realistic about the number of cake domes you take.

4-Hers with livestock exhibits at the fair are encouraged to give an informal demonstration in the livestock barn. Make sure you pre-registered in **I-14 Informal Demonstration** (Department #) before June 10th. Once you have given the demonstration, you will have the communication section of the project record done for that project, receive a premium and a very pretty ribbon.

Livestock exhibitors are encouraged to enter either class in the **General Department (I-12)** - Class 16 or 22 which is a poster or display. Class champions will be competing for a special award. This would be a project exhibit on the livestock project record.

Are you entering your items for the fair? We want our 4-Hers to enter all of their exhibits and we want our buildings full of exhibits. Take the time to consider what projects you may actually complete to enter in the fair and remember there is a simple substitution system within the indoor department. You can take an indoor entry tag and change the class number as long as the substitution is made within the same department.

- 12: Junior Stock/Hunt Seat Equitation (To be judged on the riders as in class 11. Riders will be asked to perform a pattern. Patterns will be available on show day.)
- 13: Senior Stock/Hunt Seat Equitation (To be judged on the riders as in class 12. Riders will be asked to perform a pattern. Patterns will be available on show day.)
- 14: Junior Command (Mounts are judged on their prompt obedience in performing commands. A command should be executed in three strides.)
- 15: Senior Command (Mounts are judged on their prompt obedience in performing commands. A command should be executed in three strides.)

### **Lunch Break**

- 16: Junior Crossrails (Open to horses and ponies. Mounts are judged on performance,manners, suitability and soundness. Crossrail height is 18 inches.)
- 17: Senior Crossrails (Open to horses and ponies. Mounts are judged on performance,manners, suitability and soundness. Crossrail height is 18 inches.)

High Point Champion and Reserve Champion will be presented for each division. Patterns will be given the morning of show. All exhibitors should read the General Rules and the Maryland 4-H Horse and Pony Rule Book and be familiar with these rules that will apply to the Carroll Co. 4-H & FFA Fun Schooling Show. Carroll County 4H & FFA English and Western Department Rules and Regulations will also apply to the 2023 Fun Schooling Show. Proper attire and safety equipment required at all times. Rider must use a horse(s) ID through the 4H office. Exhibitors may show English or Western; no preference will be given to either style of riding.

The June 18, 2023 Carroll County 4H & FFA Fun Schooling Show class list and details are subject to change without notice. There is no scheduled rain date. Plan ahead and have another showing opportunity in the event that this event has to be cancelled due to inclement weather or extenuating circumstances.
