Beginner Cake Decorating: Basics of cake decorating will be taught-prepare a cake for decorating, learn to color frosting and how to choose decorator bags and tips. Practice basic techniques and decorate your own cake. (This class requires a **double session A&B**). Class limited to 10. *Taught by Theresa Lilienthal* 1 Double Class 10:00-11:45 am

<u>Advanced Cake Decorating</u>: Turn your cake into something special! Practice more techniques of cake decorating. Explore other types of materials– gum paste, color flow, etc. and decorate your own cake. (This class requires a **double session C&D**). Class limited to 10. *Taught by Theresa Lilienthal* 1 Double Class 12:30-2:15 pm

Introduction to Welding: Learn the basics of welding, how it works and the different equipment used. Then try your hand at striking your own arc! Long sleeves, pants and closed toe shoes are required. Dress for the weather, some time will be spent outside. (This class requires a **double** session) Class is limited to 7. *Taught by Jen and Adam Wilson*

Introduction to Knitting: Learn the basic skills of knitting. This class will include the concepts of casting on, garter stitch and binding off. Participants will use these concepts to create a washcloth that can be entered in the Farm Fair. (This class requires a **double session A & B).** Class is limited to 5. *Taught by Jennifer Nance*

Introduction to Crocheting: Learn the basics skills of crocheting. This class will cover the concepts of creating a chain, single crochet and finishing. Participants will use these techniques to make a washcloth that can be entered in the Farm Fair. (This class requires a **double session C & D).** Class is limited to 5. *Taught by Jennifer Nance*

<u>Slime Time</u>: Have fun learning how to make slime! Class is limited to 8 participants. *Taught by Natalie McCann*

Horses 101: Join for a basic introduction to Horses-breeds, color, tack, care and more! You do not have to own or ride horses to attend and learn! One session, class limited to 8 participants. *Taught by Karen Taylor*

<u>Colander Gardens</u>: Participants will make a garden of salad greens in a colander. Class limited to 7. *Taught by Laura Grace Muir and Sophia Johnson*

Food Preservation 101: Join for a basic introduction to Food Preservation. Participants will learn about food safety and how to preserve jelly. One session, class limited to 8 participants. *Taught by Marylisa Schaedel*

Horse Jeopardy!: Join for a basic introduction to Horse Bowl and Hippology! Participants will be encouraged to test their knowledge by playing a fun round of Jeopardy! One session, class limited to 8 participants. *Taught by Karen Taylor*

<u>Advanced Food Preservation</u>: Participants will explore other food preservation projects such as herb and fruit drying . One session, class limited to 8 participants. *Taught by Marylisa Schaedel*

Fairy Gardens: Participants will design and plant their own mystical miniature dish garden. They will receive two foliage plants and design a mini garden. Special garden features can be created from natural materials in our supply box. Gravel will be provided for garden paths, a pond or stream and students can make a miniature house or bridge from provided sticks. **Participants MUST bring a planter bowl or basin which is 4-6 inches deep and preferably 12-18 inches wide .** No one will be admitted to class without their bowl or basin. Soil, stones, plants, and craft material will be provided. Class limited to 10. *Taught by Joyce Browning*
