

"Person of sterling character, maintain high ideals and ethics; loyal, resourceful, responsible with the understanding of others; a record of leadership and service; sincere interest in support of 4-H; and applies the motto "I serve".

- 1. Regular: 4-Her for at least 2 years and 15 years old before January 1 of their candidacy;
- 2. Honorary: given at least 7 years of service to 4-H on a county, state, regional or national level and was a non-4-H member as a youth;
- 3. Associate: spouses of Regular or Honorary 4-H All Stars
- 4. Extension Agent: Maryland 4-H and Youth agents who do not hold either a Regular or Honorary membership.

Please join us in welcoming our new 4-H Swine Show Superintendents, Kimmi Doran and Abbie Patrick! Please see the note below regarding new classes and changes to the Swine Show.

Dear 2024 Harford County Swine Exhibitors,

We wanted to introduce ourselves as the new swine superintendents and go over a few rule changes by both the state and the Harford County Swine Show.

Some changes to the rules are below but please make sure to read the 2024 catalog when it is released.

All hogs must be born on or after January 1st of 2024. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

All hogs must be brought to the May weigh in and **MUST HAVE** an RFID tag **IN** the ear or you will be sent home.

At any point throughout the year your hog loses a tag please contact us immediately so we can get the issues resolved.

Showmanship- if it is the exhibitors first year they are allowed and encouraged to show in both the novice division and their age division.

Hog weights are remaining the same (235-300 with 1% allowance on each side)

NEW DIVISION- we will be introducing a Purebred division this year!

All purebreds will show in weight divisions together until we can build a purebred program and then we will be adding breed divisions in upcoming years.

Your purebred hogs **MUST** be owned by May 1st and registered with the breed association and in the exhibitor's name by July 1st, 2024.

Purebred hogs MUST also have a matching ear notch to their registration papers.

Failure to comply with the above rules will result in showing the hog in the crossbred division.
