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2024 Enrollment

ALL 4-H Members, Clovers and UME Volunteers need to enroll for the 2024 4-H year. You will log into 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com) to complete your 2024 enrollment. Please note that EVERYONE (4-H MEMBERS, CLOVERS AND UME VOLUNTEERS) will need to log into their family accounts that you have already created and re-enroll each person listed on your account. DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT – LOG IN USING YOUR EMAIL AND PASSWORD. If you have forgotten your password, there is an option to restore your password.

ALL 4-H MEMBERS AND CLOVERS MUST PAY THEIR \$10 STATE PARTICIPATION FEE THROUGH 4-H ONLINE. UME Volunteers do not pay a participation fee. The insurance fee that 4-H Members, Clovers and UME Volunteers pay will still be paid through your 4-H Club.

Remember, you must be enrolled in the Carroll County 4-H Program by May 1, 2024 to be eligible to show at the 2024 Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair or to be recognized as a UME Volunteer. If you have any questions, please call the Extension Office at 410-386-2760.

It's that time of year again to start thinking about participating in the 2024 Dog Training Program.

Registration for training classes will take place on April 11th, 6:30pm at the Extension Office. Youth and parents will need to be present, along with a copy of your dog's rabies certificate and county dog license/ tag to be left on file with the trainers. Dogs without a valid rabies certificate/county dog license WILL NOT be allowed to attend training classes. If the rabies certificate expires during training, you must bring the new certificate with you at the next possible training date. If you think you might be substituting a dog within the training classes, bring those certificates/licenses with you. Please take the time to register as many dogs as you think you may need through the training classes.

Additionally, on **April 25th there will be an initial Dog Evaluation Session**. The dog(s) the youth registered to train with will need to come and be evaluated as to their suitability. If a dog is deemed to not be suitable for this kind of training, it will be dismissed. A youth may substitute another dog for training, but it must be present on April 25th for the evaluation. The minimum age for dogs participating in this program is at least 6 months of age by May 7th. There will be no classes for clover—age youth. Location for evaluation will be at the Extension Office at 6pm.

Fees for this year: A \$30 fee is required for all Carroll County 4-H Members. Payment will be accepted at the April 11th registration. The Carroll County 4-H Dog Care and Training Classes are open to Carroll County 4-H members ages 8-18. **The Training classes will be held on Tuesday evenings beginning May 7th** and will run most Tuesdays until the Fair.

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Horse Safety Class

If you are a 1st year Horse Exhibitor, you are required to attend one of the horse safety classes offered to exhibit at the 2024 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair. Exhibitors will learn about horse safety, along with an orientation about what happens on show day at the fair and what you need to bring. You MUST attend the last class on May 21st at 7pm at the Extension Office if you haven't already attended.

Horse Judging

Do you have an interest in learning more about horses? If so, Horse Judging may be the perfect opportunity for you. You do not need to own or even ride a horse, but be interested in learning more about them. You will learn a lot about horses through the judging program and have the opportunity to visit several horse farms in the area throughout the spring. All practices will begin at 7pm, but please plan to arrive a little early.

Junior Stock Show

The Junior Stock Show will be held on **Saturday**, **June 22nd at 9 A.M. at High Ridge Farm LLC**, **sponsored by High Ridge 4-H Club.** Exhibitors must arrive by 9 A.M. This is an opportunity for Clovers to participate too! The Registration form is attached to the online *Tribune* and is due by **June 18, 2024**. **This is the last opportunity for junior and novice exhibitors to attend and fulfill the workshop requirement if exhibiting a market animal and planning to be in the livestock sale.**

Market Goat and Market Lamb Weigh-In/Commercial Goat-Lamb Tagging

If you plan to exhibit a Market Goat or Market Lamb at the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair or Maryland State Fair, it must have a Maryland 4-H ear tag and be weighed in at the Carroll County 4-H Weigh-In. Market Goat and Market Lamb Weigh-In will be held on Friday, May 17th from 5-8pm at the Carroll County Ag Center (TRP Barn). You must turn in a completed 2-part Livestock Registration form to the Extension Office with the number of tags you will need. If you are planning to show a market animal and a commercial breeding animal, they MUST be on 2 separate Livestock Registration Forms. Livestock Registration Forms are due to the Extension Office by May 10th. Remember to fill in ALL information, including Scrapie tag numbers. The Animal Science Code of Ethics will be on the reverse side and BOTH pages must be signed. There will be a total of 3 signatures for the 4-Her and 3 for the parent/guardian. Tags cost \$2. Checks can be made payable to CCEAB. You must register, tag and weigh-in the appropriate animal for Carroll County. You may not weigh-in your animals at another county and be eligible for the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. Questions? Call 410-386-2760.

Castration Policy of the Maryland 4-H AnSc Program: All male steers, lambs, pigs and goats must be neutered and healed prior to 4-H weigh-in and tagging. The only exception would be animals that have obvious signs they have been banded, however, their scrotal sac is still intact.

Market Swine Weigh-In

If you plan to exhibit Market Swine at the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair or Maryland State Fair, it must have a Maryland 4-H ear tag and be weighed in at the Carroll County 4-H Weigh-In. Market Swine Weigh-In will be held on Friday, May 3rd from 5-9pm at the Carroll County Ag Center (TRP Barn). You must turn in a completed 2-part Livestock Registration form to the Extension Office with the number of tags you will need. If you are planning to show a market animal and a commercial breeding animal, they MUST be on 2 separate Livestock Registration Forms. Livestock Registration Forms are due to the Extension Office by April 26th. Remember to fill in ALL information, including RFID tag numbers. The Animal Science Code of Ethics will be on the reverse side and BOTH pages must be signed. There will be a total of 3 signatures for the 4-Her and 3 for the parent/guardian. Tags cost \$2. Checks can be made payable to CCEAB. You must register, tag and weigh-in the appropriate animal for Carroll County. You may not weigh-in your animals at another county and be eligible for the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. Questions? Call 410-386-2760.

Poultry Orientation

Poultry Exhibitors: If you are planning to OR thinking about showing anything in the Poultry Department at the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair in 2024, you are REQUIRED to attend ONE of the orientation meetings. This includes poultry, turkey, posters, eggs, Clovers, etc. This is for first year and returning exhibitors. These meetings are for the Poultry Department and do not meet any requirements for any other livestock department. These meetings are in person (no virtual meetings offered and no make up sessions offered). All meetings are at the Extension Office and begin at 7 P.M. Please check the listing on the entryway board for the room assignment.

There are 2 options left to attend:

Tuesday, April 16

Thursday, May 2

Again, you need to attend only ONE of the meetings.

Fair Reminders

Everyone is welcome to participate in Fair Board meetings held at the Extension Office/Ag Center. The next meeting will be on Wednesday, April 24th, 7:30pm.

Too many ribbons? Don't throw them away. If they are in good shape, drop them off at the Extension Office and we will recycle them for next year.

Indoor Building Updates— I will be continuing with an update on 2 indoor departments. By the time you are reading this, the calendar will show spring is here. Time to think of flowers and vegetables to be planted. There are no new classes in Garden Products, but there are some changes to descriptions in the classes.

New classes in **Plants & Flowers** are - Cockscomb (plume type or crested), Sunflower and Snapdragon. There are changes to other classes too, so please read the descriptions.

Fair Premiums are not guaranteed. Each year, our premiums are offset by money the Fair Board receives from the state. The Fair Board is concerned the amount of money may be drastically cut. That's why you will see information about the fundraisers the Fair Board is having.

Indoor exhibitors can do their part in this too. Be realistic with your entries. There are 76 classes in the Craft Department at the 2024 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair. I would love for 4-Hers to enter all these classes, but the reality is there probably isn't enough time to complete entries for all of them. They may not be interested in some of the classes and there's not enough time to enter them all during conference judging. The Fair Board can use the money saved on printing entry tags for premiums rather than lots of tags thrown away because they are not needed.

We have a simple substitution system within the indoor departments. You no longer need a new entry tag printed. You can take an entry tag in crafts, change the class number and name to a different craft and then attach to the exhibit. Substitutions can only be done within the same department.

By not providing all requested information, an individual may not receive materials associated with the project and may not be permitted to participate in shows in which animals must be tagged with the Maryland 4-H Livestock Tag. University of Maryland Extension (UME) 4-H Code of Animal Science Ethics

4-H members enrolled in animal science projects (e.g., beef, camelids, dairy, dog, goat, horse, poultry, rabbit, sheep, small pet, and swine) shall, at all times, conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship, including while with their projects and at all 4-H animal science activities and events. Their conduct should always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of 4-H and its animal science program. 4-H members, as well as parents, UME volunteers and others working with them, are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts; and their conduct and values must serve as a positive influence on others.

This Code of Ethics applies to all 4-H members who are enrolled in animal science projects, and to others (4-Hers, parents, volunteers, owners, etc.) who participate in the animal science program; and it covers daily animal care, as well as participation in competition and other 4-H animal activities and events.

4-H members and others who violate this Code of Ethics demean the integrity of 4-H and its animal science program. 4-H members who violate the code of animal science ethics are subject to sanctions including, but not limited to, forfeiture of premiums, awards, and/or auction proceeds and may be prohibited from participation in 4-H or 4-H/UME events or activities; other violators may also be subject to sanction, as appropriate. Infractions may be reviewed by 4-H and/or UME (on the local or state level, as appropriate to the infraction and to the event and/or activity in question), and/or may be subject to a fair oversight committee or other entity that oversees an activity or event. In addition, some acts may also be subject to review based upon the *Maryland 4-H Youth Code of Conduct* and/or other UME policies.

The following is a list of standards and requirements for all 4-H animal science projects, at all times, whether at home, at animal exhibitions or events, or any other 4-H event or activity.

- 1. The care of all 4-H project animals is the responsibility of the 4-H member. 4-H members must properly care for and groom their animals for the duration of their project.
- 2. All project animals must be housed at the 4-H member's residence unless a different location is submitted to and approved in writing by the local 4-H staff. Any change in location must be approved in writing by the local 4-H staff; however, it is not necessary to report direct transport to and from shows or other events.
- 3. Upon request of 4-H, UME, or other program, fair, event or animal officials, 4-H members must present proof of ownership, length of ownership, identity and/or age of all 4-H project animals owned or leased. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or identity of animal, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited. If a 4-H project animal is sold in a livestock sale, it is no longer eligible to be shown in a 4-H event in Maryland in that year. 4. 4-H members must provide appropriate animal health certificates upon request of 4-H, UME, or other program, fair, event or animal officials.
- 5. 4-H project animals must be presented to competition, activities and/or events, where they will enter the food chain, free of volatile drug residues. Animals which are presented to competition, events and/or activities that do not culminate with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and rules. 4-H project animals shall not be exhibited if drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations and rules may affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. At any time after an animal arrives on a fair or other 4-H activity or event premises, a licensed veterinarian must administer or, in consultation with fair, event, UME, or 4-H officials, direct the administration of any treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications. Drenching at any time after an animal arrives on a fair or other 4-H activity or event premises is prohibited, except when performed or directed by a licensed veterinarian in consultation with fair, event, UME, or 4-H officials for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal.
- 6. The act of enrolling in a 4-H animal science project, and/or entering a project animal in a 4-H competition, show, activity, or other event, gives consent for 4-H or UME or event authorities to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, hair, tissue, or other substance from the animal to be used for testing purposes including, but not limited to, drugs or identification. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved, and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the 4-H owner to prove otherwise at any review in regard to the matter conducted by a fair or other event or the 4-H program. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, hair, tissue or other sample, taken from a 4-H animal science project, indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally.
- 7. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counter irritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 8. Using ice, ice packs, cold packs, or cold compresses, internally or externally, other than those prescribed to relieve heat stress or a medical condition as diagnosed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 9. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices, such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical devices, or other similar practices, are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 10. All judges, fair and event officials and/or UME/4-H staff and volunteers shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect, and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them or toward exhibitors or others participating in the activity. In addition, direct criticism or interference with a judge, fair, show or event official, exhibitor, breed representative, or UME/4-H staff or volunteer before, during, or after an event or other activity is prohibited.
- 11. No one shall violate this Code of Animal Science Ethics or conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this Code of Ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this Code of Ethics.
- 12. The application of this Code of Ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition to the 4-H member whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this Code of Ethics.
- 13. By enrolling in an animal science project and/or entering an animal in a fair or other 4-H event or activity, the 4-H member, and his/her parent or guardian, consent to have disciplinary action taken by appropriate authorities (including UME, 4-H, fair, event and/or other activity officials) for violation of this Code of Animal Science Ethics and/or any other applicable rules of UME, 4-H, a fair, activity or other event, without recourse against UME, 4-H and/or other authorities. In addition, the 4-H member, and his/her parent or guardian, further understand and agree that any action which contravenes these rules, and is also in violation of federal, state, or local laws, statutes, regulations, or rules, may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

By signing this form the 4-H member and his/her parent or guardian each verify that they have read and understand the UME 4-H Code of Animal Science Ethics and the consequences of and penalties provided for violations of the Code.
