Heirlooms offer superior flavor, aroma and colors—and they are open-pollinated so fruit grown from saved seeds will be a near-100% match with the originals. ## Earn Both Bay-Wise and Pollinator Friendly Landscape Certifications at the Same Time

Does your yard provide food, water and shelter for bees, butterflies and other pollinators? You likely qualify for Pollinator Friendly Garden certification. Have you created a sustainable landscape that protects local waterways—using smart gardening practices that include minimizing use of chemicals, controlling storm water runoff, and growing some native plants? Chances are you qualify for Bay-Wise certification, as well. Apply for both! It's free (although there is a charge for the Pollinator Friendly sign).

Complete the necessary forms and we will arrange a visit to your property to discuss best gardening practices and answer questions.
