Healthy Soil for Your Farm



Are you interested in better understanding your soil and how to have a healthy soil? University of Maryland and Maryland Department of Agriculture are offering a workshop on Healthy Soils for Your Farm.

The workshop will be held on March 19th at Garrett College in

McHenry in Rm 111 of the Garrett Information Enterprise Center from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm. The program will include soil evaluation using the Maryland Soil Health Card, other tests and measures of soil health, cover crops, planting no till vegetable crops and funding for soil health practices.

Please register by March 15th by calling Garrett College at 301-387-3069. Lunch will be provided and there is no cost for the meeting.

Nutrient Management Reminders

Since we have passed March 1st, a few deadlines have passed that affect nutrient management. First, you can spread manure provided the ground is not covered with snow or frozen. Second, the Annual Implementation Report (AIR) was due on March 1st. If you have not sent it in, do so right away to avoid any sort of fine from the Maryland Department of Agriculture. If you have not called in and requested a plan be written for 2024, please do so as soon as possible as we have a long list of folks already.



Now is a great time to get soil and manure samples as well if you are needing those for your 2024 plan. While we no longer send out manure and soil samples, we do have soil bags, manure bottles, probes and all the paperwork needed to send out samples. The sample information comes back to us on email which makes completing plans simpler. Soil samples are \$10 for basic samples and manure samples \$45 through Spectrum Analytic. We have a list of other labs if you are looking for a different lab.
