According to the November 1929 National Boys and Girls Club News, Thomas Rich, from Hobart in Delaware County, New York, has the distinction of being the first person in the United States to introduce a purebred calf into Egypt.

Professor M. C. McFeetra, professor of Agriculture at Assuit College, American mission at Assuit, Egypt, purchased Thomas' 4-H calf, "named Sophis Sons Viola." It was necessary to secure a special permit to make the importation into Egypt, as formerly all stock was slaughtered at the docks.

Superintendent. The Montgomery County 4-H Office is looking for two new Superintendents to help during Fair Week.

Fair superintendents provide leadership to the overall functions of judging, exhibition and public relations in the 4-H Building during fair week. Superintendents need to be present and available at check-in, checkout and during judging times.

Superintendents also oversee the setup, workers, and the cleanup of the 4-H Building. Attend two meeting annually at the MoCo 4-H Office.

MoCo Bake Sale Coordinator. The Bake Sale Coordinator ensure that there are enough supplies (boxes/plates, napkins, tablecloths, etc.) for the bake sale, which are provided by 4-H. In addition, the Bake Sale Coordinator supervise the volunteers, and help with the sale of the baked goods. Responsibilities also include being available to receive cakes on entry day, and arrange baked items for sale during Fair weekend.

GET INVOLVED WITH THE HEART PILLOWS FOR COMFORT CASES

As the New Year 2022 starts, the weather is cold, but the Clarksburg Helping Hands (CHH) Club members' hearts are warm. The

President, Jayson L. is leading the club on a project for Comfort Cases, which is a non-profit organization whose mission is to inspire communities to bring dignity and hope to youth in foster care through Comfort, Community, Character, and Compassion. The CHH Club is planning to make heart pillows and donate them to children in foster care to show their sympathy, care, and love. They believe that TOGETHER, 4-H'ers can make a difference.

The project goals are to:

- To engage as many youths as possible! This project needs at least 25 volunteers.
- To make as many pillows as possible!
 The CHH Club plans to make 1,000 heart pillows by 2023.

Materials Needed

- Scissor
- Cardboard
- Cloth (fleece recommended)
- Sewing machine or hand sewing materials
- Pencils/pens
- Stuffing cotton
- Ruler

Instructions

- Trace a heart on your cardboard with a height of 24.5 cm and a width of 29 cm
- 2. Cut out your heart-shaped cardboard template
- 3. Put your heart template onto the cloth and trace it

- 4. Cut out the heart that you traced on the cloth
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 to make another piece of heart
- 6. Match two pieces of heart together and begin sewing, make sure to leave a roughly 6 inch opening at the end for stuffing
- 7. Then, from the opening, you reach your hand in and turn the heart inside out
- 8. Next, start stuffing the pillow
- 9. After stuffing, close the opening by sewing the heart completely
- 10. Enjoy your hand-made pillows, and have fun!

Tips: Make sure to make your sewing lines, as close to the edge as possible, so that it is invisible. You can do this by creasing each cloth inward slightly at the edge.
