4-H History

"Playing the Cow game

What did 4-H'ers do to pass the time while traveling cross-country during the mid-1930s? Why, they played the Cow Game, of course.

Miss Rose Kronmiller, Home Demonstration Agent in LaPorte county, Indiana explains the game in the September 1937 issue of

National 4-H Club News. It may be played by any number from two to a busload. The group divides into two sides, each choosing one side of the road. They then proceed to count all cows, calves (anything bovine) on their respective side. If a white horse is seen by any member, the side may double its score, but if a graveyard appears, all cows must be buried, the score becoming zero, and the group must begin counting again. (Example: 10 cows plus 2 cows plus 6 cows equals 18 cows; meet team of white horses gives 72 cows. Pass



graveyard, score zero.) "It is surprising how many white horses you see and many times scores will run into thousands and then graveyards are decidedly unwelcome but hilarious joy to the other side," Miss Kronmiller says."

MoCo 4-H Awards Ceremony


Save the date! February 25 at 7:00 PM. Heritage Building, Montgomery County Fairgrounds, Gaithersburg.

Maryland Horseman's Party

The Maryland Horsemen's party serves as the primary fundraiser for the Sallie Robertson Memorial 4-H Horse Endowment Fund. Sallie Parlette Robertson was a native of Howard County, a 4-H Alumna and owner of the famous Ship's Quarters Farms in northern Carroll County.

The goal of the Sallie Robertson Memorial 4-H Endowment Fund is to support 4-H equine educational programs, and the annual trip for 4-Hers representing Maryland at the Eastern National 4-H Horse Round Up in the areas of horse judging, hippology, horse bowl, demonstrations and public speaking. The fund may also provide scholarships for 4-H volunteers and members to attend leadership conferences, equine-related workshops and National 4-H Congress

State 4-H Livestock Skillathon

March 4, at the Montgomery County Fairgrounds.

The Skillathon provide youth with the opportunity to blend knowledge and skills acquired in livestock judging, demonstrations, care, and exhibition of animals into one activity.

Topics may include anatomy and breeds of an animal, feed used in an animal diet, wholesale and retail cuts of meat derived from an animal, and production and management of animals. Livestock studied in Skillathons includes swine, sheep, poultry and beef.

Practices are usually held at the Howard County Fairgrounds. However, there is a chance of hybrid practices.

No prior knowledge of livestock required.

Maryland 4-H Horse Bowl

This contest involves a series of questions that are asked either of a specific individual in the team, or a team. Participants use a buzzer system to 'buzz' in first and answer questions. These questions might be in the form of a regular question, toss-up, or bonus depending on the half of play. There is a variety of subject areas covered: general

equine terms, the horse industry, feeding and care, and anatomy.

The Maryland 4-H Foundation award scholarships each year to 4-H members or alumni. The 4-H members or alumni need to be enrolled at an accredited college, university or post-secondary technical training program for the fall and spring semesters of the upcoming academic year.

Maryland 4-H Dairy Skillathon

March 25, tentative. Caroll County Extension Office.

The primary objective of this contest is to provide an opportunity for 4-H'ers to demonstrate the breadth of their

knowledge and understanding of animal science and management.

The contest consists of two phases: the quiz phase and the stations phase. In the quiz phase, contestants take a written quiz with questions about the total dairy industry. The stations phase consist of a series of stations where contestants respond to the requirements of the station. Examples of stations can be general dairy equipment & milking equipment identification, dairy breed identification, feed identification, dairy cow anatomy & physiology.

Q: Developed in the Netherlands, this breed has the most registrations in the United States. Animals of this breed are black and white or red and white in color. They are known for their outstanding milking ability and vigorous appetites. Answer found on the last page of this newsletter.

Maryland 4-H Horse Judging and Hippology Contest

June 10, Howard County Fairgrounds

Horse Judging - In this event, youth make a careful evaluation of horses in a class, judging and placing them against an

accepted ideal for the breed or discipline shown. Contests usually include halter and performance classes.

The Hippology Contest mix a range of educational activities offered in the 4-H Horse Program into one event. The contest includes:

Judging. Judging may consist of placing live classes of horses or classes shown on slides or video

Written Examination. Written Examination consists of questions posed in a variety of ways. For example, multiple choice, fill in, definitions, true and false. Topics, generally, are limited to genetics, nutrition, conformation, health, behavior and history.

Identification and Anatomy. This activity test the knowledge of anatomy of the horse, breeds, breed history, colors, color patterns and equine activities. Contestants can be asked to identify tack, equipment, feed samples, grains, or hays.
