#### **Volunteers**

In 2021, UME initiated a new volunteer background check policy in order to provide for the safety and well-being of University of Maryland Extension (UME) volunteers, and staff members, and program participants, and the community. In addition to protecting UME's assets and reputation as a service provider.

The policy requires that volunteers be background-checked every 3 years. The Calendar year 2024 is the first recertification period for individuals who completed their background check in 2021.

A current volunteer needs to complete the background check process by the end of this year (2023). The State Office provided notification of the need for renewal according to the following schedule:

- September volunteers initially screened in January April of 2021
- October volunteers initially screened in May-August of 2021
- November volunteers initially screened in September – December of 2021

The notification to renew your background check will come from Sterling Volunteers.

Their email address is "theadvocates@sterlingvolunteers.com".

The background check should be completed within 30 days of the invitation to avoid separation and dismissal and ensure your 2024 enrollment is approved by the March 1 target deadline.



2023 4-H STEM Challenge-Power Protectors Kits

Explore the exciting world of renewable energy with the *Power Protector* STEM Challenge Kit.

4-H educators from Cornell University, the University of Illinois, Utah State University, and West Virginia University developed Power Protectors. Power Protectors is a collection of three activities that teach kids how to address real-world issues and explore careers in energy.

The STEM Challenge kit is perfect for youth ages 8-14 years to spark an interest in STEM and inspire real-world actions.

The kit consists of three activities that are highly adaptable for afterschool programs, 4-H clubs, classrooms, home use, and more. Each kit contains enough supplies for 6 youths and most supplies are reusable.


## **2024 Inbound Opportunities!**

#### **Record Books**

If you plan to do a Record Book for this year, please refer to the guidelines on 4-H Online.

What is a 4-H Record Book? A 4-H Record Book is a standard record of your activities in 4-H - your projects, activities, events, skills development, and learning experiences. The 4-H Record Book helps improve your skills in record keeping, goal management, and reflection on your achievements and growth in 4-H.

If you are doing a Record Book, please:

- 1. Place a rubber band around the Record Book so the book stays together.
- 2. If you are submitting your Record Book personally, or if a Club Leader is submitting Record Books, please contact a 4-H Staff to be available to receive the Record Book(s.)

#### **Record Book Format**



Record Books illustrate your 4-H experiences throughout the year. The pages in you Record Book must be placed between the Record Book covers.

The Record Book covers are available at no cost at the 4-H Office.

You should use dividers in your book for each of the sections below.

- 1. Title Page This will include a current picture, name, age, 4-H Club and address.
- 2. Table of Contents This should include all of the sections that can be found in your 4-H Record Book.
- 3. Summary Record Write all of your activities (4-H and others) throughout the year. Also, include the highlights of your projects (awards, communications, activities, etc.).
- 4. 4-H Story Write a story telling the reader about your 4-H experience. Summarize your experiences; describe your different projects and events you attended. What did you learn this year? Personalize your story! (Story should be 2-3 pages double-spaced)

5. Project Records - Include your completed project records in this section. You can find project records forms at

https://extension.umd.edu/locations/annearundel-county/4-h-youth-development/4h-forms

- 6. Pictures You can have up to 3 additional pages of pictures that highlight your 4-H year. Make sure you include a caption with each picture.
- 7. Newspaper/Social Media Post If you were featured in the 4-H County Website, or on a newspaper, you can print those posts to include in this section.

### The MOCO Sunny STEM 4-H Club Welcomes Photographer and Writer Mr. Visser as Guest Speaker

The MOCO Sunny STEM 4-H Club's October meeting welcomed photographer and writer Mr. Ken Visser as a guest speaker, who gave a lecture on "Techniques for Taking Better Photos" to the club members.

With over 20 years of Professional photography experience, Mr. Visser is the Chairman of the Indoor Exhibition Photography Department at the Montgomery County and Damascus Fairs.

Mr. Visser first explained the basic theories and concepts of photography to help club members and volunteers understand better the basics of photography. He also provided an overview of digital cameras, as well as photographic composition, lighting, and common shooting techniques. For example, what is the rule of thirds?

According to him, the rule of thirds refers to an off-center composition in which the important elements of a photo are evenly distributed on a three-by-three grid, thus dividing the image's parts equally into nine.

When composing a photograph, the intersection of each line is called the "center of interest." When people appreciate or view a photo, the first place people's eyes notice is the "interesting center", so when taking a photo, try to arrange your subject in the interesting golden center, not the exact center of the image.

He used his wonderful photos to illustrate how important it is to place your subject in the right place in the photo. Good composition can make a photo more attractive and guide the viewer's eye.

After the lecture, club members and volunteers each took out some photos and asked Mr. Visser to comment and make suggestions. Mr. Visser reviewed their photos and offered suggestions to improve, while also pointing to favorable aspects also.

Mr. Visser sincerely invites club members to participate in photography creation and collection activities with him during next year's expo.

Finally, he took a group photo with everyone.
