Dairy Bowl Contest

April 20, Carroll County Extension Office. Fee \$5.00 **Registration closes April 5, 2024.**

The 4-H Dairy Bowl Contest offers age-appropriate quizzes and match questions that are designed to test youth knowledge of the dairy industry. The practical application of the contestants' knowledge and skills is emphasized.

4-H members wishing to participate should contact the county 4-H office. Official registration for the contest will open soon in 4-H Online. Individuals participating in the statewide contest must be enrolled as a Maryland 4-H member for 2024 in 4-H Online by April 5, 2024. Contest registration must be submitted via the 4-H Online registration system by April 5, 2024.

Counties may enter up to a maximum of eight members (composed of a team of four members and four additional individuals or a team of four members/one alternate and three additional individuals) in each of the Junior, Intermediate, and Senior divisions.

Written Tests are to be administered by an authorized UME Extension employee not affiliated with the team at the county level between March 27 - April 5, 2024.

Maryland 4-H Horse Communication Contest

Registrations will be verified and approved by local 4-H Educators and the State 4-H Event Manager. Contact your local 4-H office or visit the Maryland 4-H website for more information.

The Maryland 4-H Horse Communications Contest provides an opportunity for youth enrolled in 4-H to demonstrate their public speaking skills and knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting where attitudes of friendliness and fairness prevail. For this contest, members will submit a recording of their speech or demonstration for judges to evaluate.

Three categories are offered for this contest: 1. Individual Presentation, 2. Team Presentation, and 3. Individual Public Speech. Awards are offered in three age divisions: 1. Junior (ages 8-10), 2. Intermediate (ages 11-13), and 3. Senior (ages 14-18).

Eligibility

Youth contestants must have an approved enrollment in 4-H Online for the 2024 4-H program year. Youth Contestants must not have previously competed in the category at the 4-H Horse Communications contest at the Eastern National 4-H Horse Roundup (Louisville, KY) or Western National 4-H Horse Roundup.

Maryland 4-H Public Speaking Contest

Date: Saturday, April 27, 2024 (Maryland Day), University of Maryland, College Park Check-in 9:00 am; contest starts 10:00 a.m. Fee: \$5.00 per youth contestant. County/city 4-H programs will be invoiced for their contestants after registration closes. **Registration must be submitted by 11:59 p.m., Wednesday, April 10, 2024**.

Youth who received Champion placing for their age division at their 2024 local public speaking contest in Demonstration, Extemporaneous, Interpretation, Prepared, Radio Spot, or Visual Presentation are eligible to participate. Youth can only choose one category to compete in the State contest.

The county/city 4-H Online Manager initiates the eligible youth's registration. Families cannot start their own registrations.

Once the county 4-H Online Manager initiates the registration, the family must complete and submit it. The submitted registration must then be verified and approved by the county/city 4-H Online Manager by April 15, 2024 to forward it to the State 4-H Office.

Hughes Center Offering Two Internship Programs In Summer 2024

Registration must be submitted by 11:59 p.m., Thursday, April 18, 2024.

The Harry Hughes Center for Agro-Ecology seeks students for two internship programs over the summer of 2024: the Russ Brinsfield Agro-Ecology Internship Program and a Science Communications and Outreach Internship.

The Hughes Center is affiliated with the University of Maryland College of Agriculture and Natural Resources and is located at the Wye Research and Education Center in Queenstown, Maryland. This internship is based online with occasional in-person meetings (at least twice but up to four

times throughout the 8-week internship) and travel to research site locations for video shoots (up to three times throughout the internship).

This internship focuses on communications and outreach, specifically with an eye on social media and content creation. The intern will learn how the Hughes Center's projects and scientific research interact with the state's agricultural and environmental sustainability and conservation goals and learn to communicate messages on scientific topics to lay audiences. This internship will provide the opportunity to learn and practice various aspects of public outreach, content creation and distribution, and analytics. The chosen intern will work directly with the Hughes Center's communications coordinator to develop online outreach plans for the Center's research and projects.

Session 2, June 22, 1:00 - 5:00 p.m. Frederick County 4-H Campgrounds, Frederick MD. Registration for Session 2 must be submitted no later than by 11:59 p.m., June 19, 2024. Fee for youth participants \$10.00. No fee for adult Volunteer participants.

Each Session is limited to 30 4-H youth registrations. There is no limit on the number of 4-H Volunteers at each session.

This event will be held in two locations, with the same program delivered at both locations. Some workshop elements may be delivered virtually; and most elements will be delivered in-person

The 2024 Maryland 4-H Robotics Workshops are intended for 4-H youth, and volunteer leaders/coaches who are considering or planning to participate in the annual Maryland 4-H Robotics Challenge at the 2024 Maryland State Fair.

The workshops will offer information about this year's robotics challenges, including the missions and specific rules relating to each challenge's theme. In addition, there will be breakout sessions focused on each of the two Maryland 4-H Robotics Challenges: the Lego Challenge and the Robotics Engineering Challenge (REC). Each breakout session will include challenge-specific rules, plus building and coding recommendations for teams that intend to compete. Finally, some general guidelines for coaches and teen leaders, including how to distribute team tasks, help teams manage their Engineering notebook, and how to prepare for their presentations, will be shared by event leaders and from members of teams who have competed in the past.

Sheep and Goat Skillathon

Sunday, May 5, 2024, Maryland Sheep and Wool Festival, Howard County Fairgrounds. Fee: \$5.00. The fee will help to defray the cost of refreshments, awards, and supplies. **Registration, May 1, 2024.**

The Sheep & Goat Skillathon is open to any youth between the ages of 8 and 18. Youth will compete according to their age on January 1, 2024 (4-H age). Individuals from any county, state or province may compete. Pre-registration is required. Participants should bring clipboards and pencils to use during the contest.

A skillathon tests the youth's broad knowledge of a topic. At the sheep and goat skillathon, all stations will pertain to sheep and goats. Stations in the past have included breed ID, feed/forage ID, meat ID and judging, equipment ID, hay judging, fleece (wool) judging, sheep judging (wool or dual-purpose breed), and fiber ID. There have also been stations pertaining to animal health (general disease and parasites).

The Maryland 4-H Foundation Scholarship Application for academic year 2024-2025 is open.

Registration must be submitted by 11:59 p.m., June 15, 2024.

The Maryland 4-H Foundation opportunity for academic scholarships to Maryland 4-H members and Maryland 4-H alum pursuing post-secondary education at a college, university or post-secondary technical training program. The Maryland 4-H Foundation awards an average of \$50,000 in scholarships annually.

Applicants must be a currently enrolled Maryland 4-H member or a Maryland 4-H Alumni in good standing who has completed at least two (2) years of membership in Maryland 4-H. They must be planning to enroll in an accredited college, university or postsecondary technical training program for both the fall and spring semesters of the 2024-2025 academic year.

*Students completing their post-secondary education in December of 2024 are ineligible to apply.
