show. This event serves as a "practice show" giving young people an opportunity to learn more about showmanship and practice working with their animals.


Learn By Doing The 4-H Way

Garrett County 4-H STEM aims to provide enjoyable and interactive hands-on activities that nurture an interest in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics among young people in Garrett County. The 4-H motto "Learn by doing" is frequently highlighted, enabling youth to develop confidence and gain knowledge independently.

Karen Wood, 4-H STEM Educator, conducted programs at 4 In-School sites, 3 After-School sites, and 5 Library sites in Garrett County, delivering 103 programs to 287 young enthusiastic participants during the 2023-2024 academic year. The programs covered a wide range of topics, including robotics, digital media, coding, electricity, and more.







4-H Camp Ranked One Of The Best!

Exciting News! The Maryland 4-H Environmental Education and Camping Center, casually known as the Western Maryland 4-H Center, in Swanton, Maryland has won Newsweek Magazine's latest award, America's Best Summer Camps 2024! This award is based on an extensive research study, planned and executed by Plant-A Insights Group. The study encompassed the votes and opinions of more than 30,000 interviewed parents, over 600,000 social media reviews. Camps were rated on criteria like selection of offered activities, accessibility, staff-to-children ratio and camp safety. More than 3,500camps were studied. Read full article <u>HERE</u>.

Last year, the American Camping Association released <u>a study</u> showing that 58 percent of youth said their time at summer camp "helped them appreciate the importance of being present in the moment." High Tunnel Construction Workshops



High tunnels are used by many vegetable farmers to extend the growing season. A high tunnel is a greenhouse-like structure that allows producers to start planting earlier in the spring and grow later into the fall. These structures are very beneficial in Garrett County with our colder climate and short growing season. Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) has funding available

through EQIP to purchase and construct tunnels. The funding will cover the cost of the tunnel and construction cost. Farmers can construct their own tunnels at a considerable cost savings. In April, University of Maryland offered a hands-on high tunnel construction workshop. Attendees learned about the basic parts and construction of a high tunnel with both classroom and hands on high tunnel construction. A second high tunnel construction workshop is being planned for late July. Even if you don't think you would build your own tunnel, the workshops are valuable for planning, learning about the construction and future maintenance of the structure.
