There are a variety of events and activities related to the 4-H Animal Science projects.



QUICK & EASY REINDEER PIZZA QUESADILLAS

Ingredients*

- 2 whole meal tortilla wraps
- 1 Tbs red pesto
- Handful grated cheese
- ½ red pepper
- 1/4 green pepper

To decorate (optional):

- 3 cherry tomatoes
- 6 black olives
- 12 plain pretzels



Method:

- Prepare your fillings grate the cheese, de-seed and chop the peppers.
- 2. Lay a tortilla wrap in a frying pan. Spread the pesto all over the tortilla, leaving a small gap around the edge.
- 3. Sprinkle the grated cheese over the top of the pesto.
- Scatter over the chopped peppers or other fillings** of your choice.
- Place the second tortilla on top to form a sandwich with the fillings in the middle.
- Dry-fry the tortilla for a couple of minutes until the base is golden. Once the base is cooked, pop a plate on top of the pan and flip the pan over, then carefully slide the quesadilla back into the pan to cook on the other side. Cook for a few minutes more until the cheese is melted and the quesadilla cooked through.
- Slide the quesadilla out of the pan and onto a chopping board and cut it into 6 wedges. Place on the plate or platter that you'll be serving it up on.
- Slice the cherry tomatoes in half, and add one half to the tip of each guesadilla wedge for the reindeer noses.
- Cut the olives into rings, then add two rings to each quesadilla wedge for the reindeer eyes.
- 10. Place 2 pretzels on each quesadilla wedge for the reindeer antlers.

*Other Filling Options: Chopped veggies – red onion, spring onion, spinach, mushrooms, cherry tomatoes, sweetcorn, peas, cooked broccoli, finely chopped cooked potato, sweet potato or squash. Cooked meat – ham, chorizo, pepperoni, shredded chicken, turkey, bacon or sausage.



4-H RECORD BOOKS DUE FEBRUARY 1

It is never too earlier to start wrapping up your 2024 record book. 4-H record books for 2024 are due to the 4-H office by **February 1, 2024**. Diamond Clover Levels 1 to 4 are also due at this time.

 To meet fair eligibility to show livestock - Members must submit a complete record book with a completed project sheet for each project exhibited at the 2024 Allegany County Fair to show at the 2025 Allegany County Fair.

For a complete guide and forms go to https://go.umd.edu/AC-forms. It is recommended that you use a 3-ring binder or 3-prong folder for your record book. Traditional 4-H record book covers are available at the office for \$3.50 each, but not required.

4-H DIAMOND CLOVER LEVELS

Levels 1 to 4 - If you have completed these levels in 2024, they are due to our office by **February 1** (with record books).

Level 5 - If you have completed Level 5 for 2024, please submit your form to the 4-H office by **November 1.** This will allow time for your name to be submitted for the 2025 4-H Gala.

Level 6 - The Diamond Clover Level 6 Service Learning Project enables a 4-H member to demonstrate life skills including leadership, planning, and organization as they complete a major community service project. If you would like to start a Level 6 project, email Michelle, mharman2@umd.edu for guidance.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR 4-H EVENTS

Applications are due two weeks before the registration deadline for the event. Applicants may not apply for more than two scholarships within a calendar year.

2025 4-H ENROLLMENT

Families may enroll with Maryland 4-H Online beginning in January 2025. Watch for an email announcement for the opening date.

To enroll in Maryland 4-H Online, you need to use Firefox, Chrome, or Safari web browsers. Go to https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in



- Current Members Enrollments are due by February 1, 2025.
- New Livestock Members Enrollments are due by April 1 to show animals at the fair.
- New Members Enrollments are due by June 1, 2025 to be eligible to participate in the county and state fairs.
- Volunteers Enrollments for returning volunteers must be completed by March 1.

It is important to enroll as soon as you can, so you will continue to receive the newsletter, email updates and other important announcements.

As a reminder, projects and volunteer types & roles will not roll over into next year. You will need to select your projects and volunteer information again. Volunteers, check your volunteer type in 2024 so you will know what to select in 2024. If you are unsure, please call 301-724-3320 or email jparrish@umd.edu.

The Maryland 4-H Behavioral Expectations, MD 4-H Disciplinary Policy & Procedures, Photo/Media Release, and Maryland 4-H Code of Animal Science Ethics (livestock projects) are part of the online enrollment process and will be signed electronically.

Enrollment fee - Maryland 4-H has an annual \$10.00 enrollment fee per 4-H member (No fee is collected for volunteers and any children in a family with more than three children). Families will pay the enrollment fee online by credit card at the time they enroll.
