The Maryland 4-H Foundation Scholarship

The Maryland 4-H Foundation is proud to offer the opportunity for academic scholarships to Maryland 4-H members and Maryland 4-H alum pursuing post-secondary education at a college, university or post-secondary technical training program. The Maryland 4-H Foundation awards an average of \$50,000 in scholarships annually.

The Maryland 4-H Foundation Scholarship Application for the academic year 2025-2026 is open. The deadline to apply is June 15, 2025, by 11:59 p.m.

Applicants must be a currently enrolled Maryland 4-H member or a Maryland 4-H Alumni in good standing who has completed at least two (2) years of membership in Maryland 4-H. They must be planning to enroll in an accredited college, university, or post-secondary technical training program for both the fall and spring semesters of the 2025-2026 academic year.

**Students completing their post-secondary education in December of 2025 are ineligible to apply.*

If your child is under 13 years old, a "parent account" is required to assist with monitoring your child's online activities.

Club Leaders can also sign up for CLOVER by 4-H and can view all of the content to find potential club activities and even manage multiple learner accounts for their clubs.

In addition, the very best part is that CLOVER by 4-H is free!

Animal Husbandry and Quality Assurance (AHQA)

Animal Husbandry and Quality Assurance (AHQA) is now open! Registration is due on **July 15**. You can access the AHQA through <https://ahqa.umd.edu/>

You will need to complete the program if:

- You are new to 4-H (any age) OR
- You are 11 as of January 1 (moving from junior to intermediate) OR
- You are 14 as of January 1 (moving from intermediate to senior) OR
- Are an intermediate or senior with a new project animal

The 2025 program must be completed using Firefox, Chrome, Edge, or Safari web browsers. Internet Explorer does not support the program. The narrated program contains two levels, a Junior-aged Level and an Intermediate/Senior-aged Level. The program automatically directs members to the correct level based on their birthdate. 4-H'ers are required to complete the on-line training program when they reach each 4-H age division, juniors (8-10), intermediates (11-13), seniors (14-18) – all as of January 1 of the current year). OR when an Intermediate or Senior 4-H member chooses to show a new species since last completing the program within their age division - they must return to the program and complete it for the new species area. The Junior program does not have species-specific sections like the Intermediate/Senior program does. Passcodes issued to members between 2015-2024 should still be viable for returning members.

All 4-H members enrolled in alpacas, beef, dairy, goats, horse and pony, llamas, poultry, sheep, swine, and rabbits are required to have completed the on-line training prior to August 10 to be eligible to exhibit their project animals in 2025 Maryland County 4-H and State 4-H Shows. Counties may set earlier deadlines to accommodate their local program.

If you do not see the red "forgot your password" or "register new user" at the top of the page, then you may have to zoom out from your browser.

4-H Fair Indoor Building Chairpersons Needed

Montgomery County 4-H is in search of enthusiastic volunteers to fill vacant Chairperson positions at the fair on entry day. If you are new to 4-H or never have volunteered at the fair, here is your opportunity to meet other 4-H members and make the Best Better! Do not worry; you will receive "on-the-job" training. What are the responsibilities of a 4-H Indoor Building Chairperson?

A Chairperson in the 4-H Indoor Building ensures entries are registered into the appropriate class, and displays entries after judging for a pleasing display.

Specifically:

- A Chairperson must be available during registration on Wednesday for Non-Perishable Entries, or on Saturday for Perishable Entries, as appropriate, prior to the fair.
- A Chairperson ensure all entries are registered in the proper classes and ready for judging, reclassifying entries as needed.
- Communicate to the judges our judging philosophy and criteria and ensure that materials for the Division are complete.
- During the judging process, be available to resolve problems and address concerns, mediating and making decisions as needed, and consulting with the Superintendent when required.
- Ensure entry class changes are properly noted for updating in ShoWorks.
- Ensure all entries' awards are properly noted, ribbons are distributed, and special awards decided.

We encourage all our 4-H members to participate and enter many exhibits at the 76th Montgomery County Agricultural Fair, August 8–16, 2025.

All 4-H Indoor Bldg and animal registrations must be entered online by July 20.

Montgomery County Agricultural Fair Information

Fair Ticket Pricing

As a 4-H'er 12 and older, if you enter exhibits at the fair, you will get a free weekly pass!

As in the past, free and reduced-price entry tickets will be made available to 4-H members and their families. Purchasing can occur when you enter exhibits on line or weekdays at the Fair Office between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. after July

15, or between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on one of the Volunteer Workdays on Saturday, July 19, 26, or August 2. After these dates, tickets are only available at the advertised price.

The following free tickets for Fair admission will be provided to 4-H'ers 12 and older who enter exhibits:

- 4-H indoor exhibitors and those with poultry, rabbits, pet show, and dog show will be provided with 1 season pass that includes free parking at Perry Pkwy.
- 4-H exhibitors with horses, beef, dairy, swine, goats, and sheep will be provided with 1 season pass including free parking at all entrances.
- 4-H exhibitors with horses, beef, dairy, swine, goats, and sheep, whose parents are not Associate or Life Members, will be provided with an additional season pass including free parking at all entrances.

The following tickets are available for purchase by 4-H member families until 12:30 p.m. on the final Volunteer Saturday Workday.

- Season Pass that includes Free Parking at Perry Pkwy. only - \$50.00
- Season Pass – special pass for non-exhibitor sibling of a 4-H member (age 12-18) Perry Pkwy only - \$18.00
- 1-Day ticket – 4-H Family, Free Parking at Perry Pkwy. only - \$10.00
- 1-Day ticket – 4-H Family, entrance only, no parking - \$5.00

FREE shuttle service to the Fairgrounds, check mcagfair.com for more information. Free Shuttle Buses will be available from August 8-16, starting at 10:00 a.m. everyday.

- The last bus leaves for the Fairgrounds at **9:00 p.m. during the week.**

Fair Volunteers Needed!

Please remember to sign-up to volunteer at the Fair. Every single 4-H volunteer is very important and very much appreciated!

Youth volunteers: This is a great opportunity to earn Student Service Learning (SSL) hours towards graduation.

You also have the opportunity to become a Life Member of the Montgomery County Agricultural Fairgrounds and get a free Life Member pass to the fair (visit the fairgrounds website for information on this program:

<https://www.mcagfair.com/general-information/volunteer-information/> and click on the Volunteer Information tab.

Each Fair workday you will need to find the unique QR code for clocking in and out that day only. These codes will be at the Gazebo, the Heritage building and each Department. You MUST clock in and out to get credit for your SSL hours. You are eligible to earn SSL hours the summer before you enter 6th grade.

- Only people who are 12 and up can receive hours towards a Life Membership.
- You must choose one. You cannot receive SSL hours and hours towards a Life Membership at the same time.

Do Not Forget to Sign in and out When You Get to the Fair!

If you intend to work towards a Fair Life Membership, you must sign in and sign out on the workdays at the Fair Office Gazebo, at the Heritage Building, or the book that is in your Department.

If you are volunteering during the fair, you need to sign in at that location.

If you leave the fairgrounds, do not forget to get your hand stamped for re-entry. Otherwise, you will have to pay to get back on the grounds.

Fair Workdays

Saturdays July 19, 26, and August 2.

You do not need to register for Fair Workdays in advance—just show up. Sign in on the computer at the Fair Office Gazebo off Chestnut Street, or at the Heritage Building.

Workdays begin at 8:00 a.m., department superintendents will determine when the workday ends, usually between Noon and 2:00 p.m. If you arrive and sign in by 9:00 a.m., you will receive one free lunch ticket. Do not forget to ask for it. Tickets will not be handed out after 9:00 a.m.

As per Maryland Department of Agriculture, all rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear for positive identification. This is a rule that must be enforced as animals in the pet show are subject to inspection and held to the same standards as all other livestock.

The Montgomery County Rabbit Club has generously offered free tattoo(s) for any rabbit(s) entered in the pet show on the last workday, August 2 in the morning. Please look for the Fair Veterinarian if your rabbit needs a tattoo.

Share at the Fair

Parade Floats

The 2025 4-H Parade Theme for the Montgomery County Agricultural fair is "Bee-lieve in yourself with 4-H".

The 4-H Parade theme complements this year's Agricultural Fair theme of "Make a Bee-line to the Fair".

For comprehensive parade rules, please check the printed and online catalog when available. In the meantime, please use the following guidelines for brainstorming and constructing your float.

Each float or special unit must send a float entry form and narrative script to the 4-H Office by June 30. The narrative should not exceed 40 words. The float theme should not need to be explained by a script.

Entering Your Work at The Fair

4-H Indoor and demonstration entry registrations must be entered online by July 20. Each exhibit must have a pre-printed tag firmly attached to it on entry night.

An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per class.

Exhibitors are responsible for verifying the accuracy of their entries. If you have a problem or correction, you **MUST** contact the Fair Office in person or by phone at 301-926-3100. It is highly recommended that all exhibitors bring their On-Line Entry Receipt with them to entry night.

Monitor the Montgomery County Agricultural fair website for information on when you can start entering exhibits online.

When entering online, please make sure you are entering in the desired 4- H Division or Open. Please print a receipt for your records.

If you are not able to enter your exhibits using the online system, paper entry forms are available in the back of the fair catalog. Please mail all paper entry forms, by July 20, 2025, to the Fair Office (NOT THE 4-H OFFICE): Montgomery Co. Agricultural Fair, 16 Chestnut St., Gaithersburg, MD 20877.

Once the fairground receives all 4-H entry registrations, they generate the display tags for each entry. Leaders will be notified when tags are ready to pick up.

Display tags must accompany each indoor entry at the fair. You must make an appointment to pick up your tags at the 4-H office. Alternatively, you can pick up your tags at the Fairground on entry day. If you wish to volunteer to help sort tags, contact Jeannine Shriver at jshriver@umd.edu.

Exception to the July 20 pre-entries deadline. ONLY for Divisions 13-Vegetables and Fruits, 14-Flowers, and 15 – Agricultural Products. Pre-entry will not be a requirement for Divisions 13, 14, and 15 but are encouraged, before 20 July. This includes all vegetables, fruits, flower specimens, and agricultural products. We understand that the weather and other environmental factors play a vital role in these entries and their success. Because these factors make it difficult to know what your entries might be a month ahead of time, we encourage you to enter as many classes in these Divisions online. However, we will accept on-site entries in Divisions 13, 14, and 15 only.

Blank entry tags will be provided at check-in for divisions 13, 14, and 15. These items will be received on Saturday, August 10, from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. as usual. Remember to arrive early to give our youth enough time to fill out their tags. Poster boards will be placed with a “how-to” fill out your tag, and volunteers will be stationed at the check-in table to help our youth fill these out.

How to bring your indoor entries to the 4-H Building at the Fair

Saturday, August 9, 4-H Perishable entry drop-off, 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. NO LATE DROP-OFFS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 6:00 P.M.

Pick up day—Sunday, August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

All exhibits unclaimed by Sunday, August 17 at 2:00 p.m. will become the property of the fair. EXHIBITS WILL NOT BE TAKEN BACK TO THE 4-H OFFICE.

In addition, the Fair or the 4-H Office will NOT be responsible for any damage to an exhibit while at the fair.

Booths and Banners State Guidelines

Please remember, the State Fair guidelines for entering booths and banners are different from the Montgomery County Fair.

Banners: ALL clubs may enter their banners in the State Fair. However, Clubs must enter them themselves using the online State Fair entry system.

Booths: ONLY County Fair champion "State Fair Themed Booths" can be entered at the State Fair.

If you wish to enter your banner or booth, make sure it complies with the State Fair Catalog rules.

You are responsible for getting your booth or banner to and from the State Fair.

The 2025 State Fair Booth/Banner Theme can be found under "Department T - 4-H/FAA Promotion".

Banner dimensions: 50" wide X 38" tall. The opening for the pole should be a minimum of 3", and is included in the overall size of 38" long. Do not bring your own pole. You MUST use these dimensions or you will be disqualified.
