You may earn Bay-Wise certification if you have created a sustainable landscape that improves water quality, soil health and habitat for wildlife while protecting and supporting Maryland watersheds.

We welcome your application for one or both of these certifications. Just complete the necessary forms and we will arrange a visit to your property to discuss your use of best gardening practices and answer any questions you may have. ### **VEGGIES DONATED TO FOOD BANK**

The Frederick County Master Gardeners have been busy growing vegetables and fruits in the Susan Trice Demonstration Garden located behind the University of MD Extension Office. As of mid-August, more than 170 pounds of produce had been given to the Frederick Food Bank, an estimated value of \$900 based on farmers' market prices.

In addition to extensive beds showcasing various ways to grow edible plants, our demonstration areas include a charming Children's Garden, woodland-edge plantings and a paw-paw patch, a hedgerow alongside Montevue Lane, and perennial beds on the side and front of the building.
