Featured Program MPP COMMUNITY GARDEN

I have to admit at least a small amount of bias for the Lexington Manor Passive Park Community Garden...after 4 years of planning and finally opening for the 2024 season, it felt like a hard-won victory. Now in its second year, the garden is thriving under the management of Carla Wilson, one of our 2024 MG Class Interns.

It's also truly an intersectional space, supported by so many community programs, it's hard to list them all. But most importantly, there are a number of Master Gardeners who support the garden as voices on the Steering, Planting, Educational, and Composting Committees. Notably, Janet Marks has taken the helm of the Planting Committee, planning spring and fall crops for the approx ~3700 sq ft of publicly managed space within the larger garden (**see Spotlight below).

Some of our other 2024 MG Class (Gena Wade, Darcy White, and Sandy Witham) have been knocking out volunteer hours by teaching students from the Building Bridges Program using the garden as an educational space for the kids to get their first hands on gardening experience. Other students from Bay Montessori, under the expert guidance of Deb Pence, have a plot, as well.

The welcome addition of a native garden, planted just outside the gates last fall, is a joint effort of St. Mary's Co Master Gardeners (Marlene & Bill Smith, and Liz Ward) as well as members of the SOMD Audubon Society (Molly Moore, a Charles Co MG!), St. Mary's County Master Naturalists, and the Natural Resources Management class from the Dr. James A. Forrest Career and Technology Center.

A wholesome tapestry of community collaboration, the garden is truly part of the "ecosystem" of Lexington Park. Environmentally, it scored high on the Baywise Yardstick and qualified for certification. Thanks to our Baywise MGs, Linda Crandall and Deb Pence (again!), for facilitating that process.

Methodical. Committed. Downright funny.


