

The Appalachian Farm and Food Alliance (AFFA) is a regional non-profit committed to fostering a resilient, sustainable, and equitable food and agriculture system across Western Maryland and the Potomac Highlands. Its core mission involves facilitating collaboration between agricultural producers and food system service providers to address and provide solutions for food insecurity. To directly aid the community, AFFA updated the "Hungry" Brochure, a vital, user-friendly resource that consolidates essential, up-to-date information on local food resources and donation

Her participation in the Maryland State Fair consisted of multiple exhibits in the Indoor Exhibit Categories for six years and was a judge for the LEGO Challenge.

Turkey Zipline Challenge


In November, Garrett County 4-H presented the Turkey Zipline Challenge to libraries and after school programs reaching over 80 youth. Each participant constructed a turkey carrier using up to 15 Lego pieces, including a top and bottom base and a pulley system. The goal was to ensure a toy turkey could successfully travel down a 15 foot zipline and into the barn without falling out. The challenge allowed youth to use the Engineering Design Process to explore different carriers for the turkey's journey.

Lawn Fertilizer Blackout Dates Began November 16th



Blackout Dates for Lawn Fertilizer Applications began on November 16th and will remain in place until March 1, 2026. The purpose of these blackout dates is to protect local streams and the Chesapeake Bay from fertilizer runoff during late fall and winter.
