- Initiated and organized a yard sale for STEM 4-H Club, which raised \$800 in startup funds (2025).
- Served as acting secretary of STEM 4-H Club after member resignation. Created the monthly agenda, wrote minutes, and conducted roll calls (2025).
- Created an science display at the Maryland State Fair that was awarded “Certificate of Excellence” from the Maryland Department of Everything (2025).
- Represented Clover County at the Maryland State Fair in 4-H Presents! Program as a vocalist. Awarded Excellent Blue Ribbon (2025).

- Train green horses for Clover Vaulters at the walk and trot level for local and regional competitions (2021-Present).

- Learned **communication and social skills** by serving as a Clover County 4-H Club ambassador for visiting state government leaders (2023).
- Learned **marketable skills** by handling money and making change at bingo night, which helps me to understand financial statements and the Treasurer's Reports for my 4-H clubs (2022-2023).
