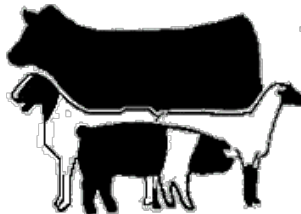

Please join us on Friday, July 26, 2019 at 6:00 PM for the 39<sup>th</sup> Annual Cecil County Fair 4-H Livestock Sale. This is your opportunity to support local 4-H youth and to purchase some of Cecil County's finest hand raised beef, pork, lamb, chevon, rabbits, chickens and ducks. The Livestock Sale marks the culmination of months of hard work when 4-H members offer their project animals for sale to the highest bidder. Proceeds often go to fund college educations. Buyers get the satisfaction of supporting hard working 4-H youth, recognition for buying the best, and can usually deduct the cost as a business advertising expense. Buyers of champion animals will have their pictures taken with their purchases to be published in a local newspaper. A banner will be presented to buyers of champion and reserve champion animals.

Even if you do not need a freezer full of meat, you can still support local 4-H youth by buying an animal and returning it to the Sale Committee. The Sale Committee will sell the animal for you at the market price and all you will owe is the difference between your bid price and the market price. You can expect 600 pounds of meat from a 1,000-pound steer; 175 pounds of pork from a 250-pound hog; 50 pounds of lamb from a 100-pound lamb; 40 pounds of chevon from an 80-pound goat. Prior to processing broilers weigh over 3 pounds each, meat ducks weigh over 7 pounds each and meat rabbits weigh 3-5 pounds each. Don't need a whole steer, hog, lamb or goat...then bring a friend, split the meat and the cost. The Sale Committee will make arrangements to transport your animal to the Cecil County processor but buyers are responsible for the processing costs. Rabbit and poultry processing is the responsibility of the buyer.

To preview the animals, attend the Poultry Show, Saturday, July 20 at 3:00 PM; Rabbit Show, Sunday, July 21, at 9:00 AM; Meat Goat Show, Monday, July 22 at 9:00 AM; Sheep Show, Tuesday, July 23 at 9:00 AM; and the Swine, Beef and Dairy Steer Shows on Wednesday, July 24 at 9:00 AM. Do not miss the opportunity to get recognition for your business and buy top quality meat. Attend the Cecil County Fair 4-H Livestock Sale.

## **Tax Benefits from Supporting the Cecil County 4-H Livestock Sale**

Thank you for participating as a buyer at the Cecil County 4-H Livestock Sale. We appreciate your support of 4-H and of our 4-H members who will receive the benefits of your patronage at this sale. You may be eligible to receive certain tax benefits by buying a 4-H livestock animal.

Businesses that buy animals may claim their participation in the sale as a business advertising expense. The buyer determines the expense amount. It is not based on the cost of the animals purchased, but rather the value of business promotion received from the sale. This includes the display of buyer's information in the livestock building at the fair, printing of the buyers list in the next Cecil County Fair catalog, and articles in local newspapers.

Businesses or individuals who donate money or goods (not services) to a 4-H club or the Cecil County 4-H program may qualify for a deduction as a charitable contribution. 4-H organizations are covered under section 170(b)(1)(A)(VI) of the 1986 tax code. These donations must be made to the 4-H club or 4-H organization and may not be earmarked for a specific individual. This would apply if you purchase an animal and donate it back for resale, with your purchase price being donated to a 4-H organization.

Businesses or individuals who purchase 4-H livestock may not claim a tax deduction for any portion of the purchase as a charitable contribution (unless donated back as explained above). This is because your payment is earmarked for the 4-H youth who raised the animal, not a charitable organization.

Other conditions may apply. Contact your accountant or the Internal Revenue Service.
