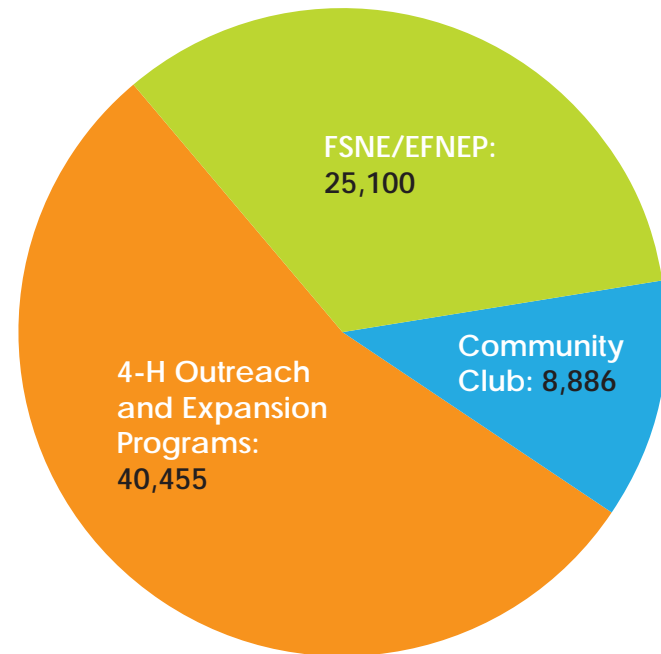

Total membership: 74,441

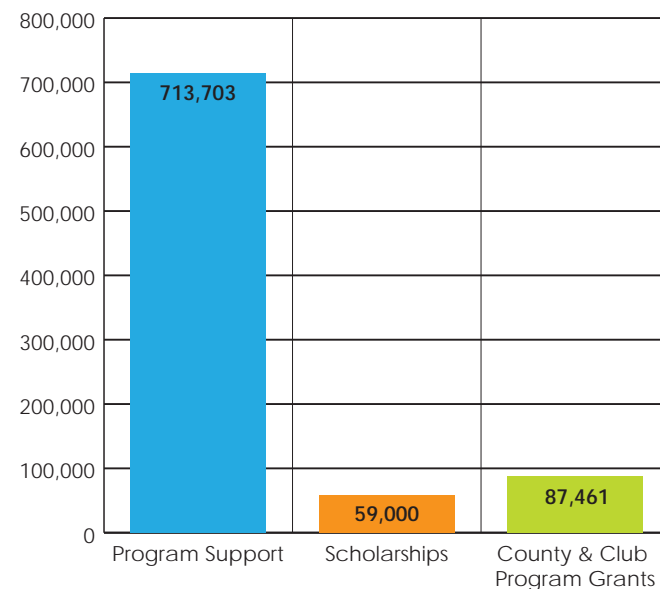
Volunteer Numbers
