Directions to Bedford Elks:

From Centerville, PA:

Drive north on US 220 for 10 miles.
Turn right onto Business 220. Go 5 miles.
Bedford Elks is on the right.

From Everett, PA:

Drive west on US 30 for 6 miles. Bear left onto Business 30. Stay on this (Pitt Street) for .5 mile. Turn left on Richard Street. Go 1 mile. Bedford Elks is on the left.

From Schellsburg, PA:

Drive east on US 30 for 7 miles. Bear right onto Business 30. Stay on this (Pitt Street) for 1 mile. Turn right on Richard Street. Go 1 mile. Bedford Elks is on the left.

From points north:

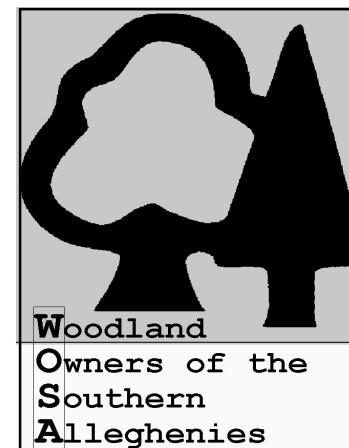
Take exit 1 off I-99. Turn right onto Business 220. Go 3.5 miles. Bedford Elks is on the left.
