Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a member in good standing of a Carroll County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter
- Must be accepted to or already attending a College or Vocational School
- Must exhibit Beef, Sheep, or Swine at the County level
- Applications **must be** complete.

A complete application should include:

- 4-H or FFA accomplishments, participation, leadership as described on the application
- Academic Standing- **Candidates must furnish a transcript**
- Letter to selection committee from the candidate, telling why he/she should be awarded this scholarship
- Please include two letters of recommendation

Selection will be based on:

1. Application
2. Financial need
3. Candidates may be interviewed. Please include a phone number to be reached.

This Scholarship may be awarded more than once to any Candidate as long as eligibility requirements are met.

The decision of the selection committee will be final. The recipient(s) will be recognized at the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale.
