

Maryland 4-H Volunteer Orientation

The Maryland 4-H Volunteer Orientation is designed to provide a new volunteer with a foundation of information and expectations to assist as they start in an appointed volunteer role. It covers UME policies and procedures and details the process to becoming an certified UME 4-H Volunteer. The Orientation Training Lessons include:

- **The History of 4-H** History of Extension and 4-H, Maryland 4-H structure
- **Volunteer Process** Steps to becoming a volunteer, expectations, code of conduct
- **Positive Youth Development Practices** Essential Elements and Ages and Stages
- **Organizational Standards** Roles, responsibilities, risk management and supporting UMD
- **Resources and Opportunities** County and state volunteer needs and resources to help volunteers learn their new role.

The Maryland 4-H Volunteer Orientation is a required part of the Maryland 4-H Volunteer Onboarding Process and is offered in a variety of ways including:

In-Person Orientation

Volunteer Orientation training can be delivered in person at your county office, anytime throughout the year. Work with your county 4-H Team to make arrangements most convenient to you.

Online Orientation

- Maryland 4-H also offers an Online Webinar Orientation Training monthly via Zoom.
- Registering for a webinar is done by contacting your local 4-H Team. **Only 4-H staff/faculty** can register volunteers for the online orientation.
- These webinars allow you to participate from the comfort of your home. If you need any assistance attending these webinars, please contact your local 4-H office.
- Participants will need access to a computer with internet connection as well as a telephone.
- These sessions will not be recorded.

Video Orientation
