#### **STEER WEIGH-IN**

The 2022 steer weigh-in and ear tagging for State Fair will be held on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>January 8<sup>th</sup></u> at the Charles County Fairgrounds from 9-11 a.m. County Fair weigh-in will be <u>Saturday</u>, <u>February 5<sup>th</sup></u> from 9-11 a.m. If you are planning to raise a steer for 4-H <u>you must bring</u> the steer to the fairgrounds at these times. You <u>must</u> register your steer with the 4-H office by <u>Monday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>.</u>

#### SKILLATHON PRACTICES START

#### **2022 Quality Assurance On-line Classes**

All youth participating in livestock are <u>required</u> to take these classes. There are two separate classes:

- 1) an on-line Quality Assurance training when the dates are announced if you are:
  - a. First time shower
  - b. Have moved up an age division
  - c. Added a species that you have not shown in the past.
- 2) an in-person species workshop at the county level to show at the fair. The dates are listed below.

### MARK YOUR CALENDARS!!! In-Person Quality Assurance

This is a reminder that there are **MANDATORY** inperson Quality Assurance sessions that you MUST attend if you plan to show livestock in 2022. You need to attend the classes that apply to your species. The youth that show multiple species may need to attend multiple classes. These classes are designed to ensure that consumers are buying the best and safest products at our livestock auction at the fair. There is a Beef and Swine class, a Sheep and Goat class, and a first time showers class.

The in-person quality assurance classes will be: Beef & Swine- March 24, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.
Sheep & Goat- April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.
First Time Showers- May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.

### 2022 Requirements and Deadlines for Livestock

Mark these dates on your calendar NOW for 2022; deadlines sneak up on us!

- 1) You <u>must own and register</u> a market steer by <u>January 3, 2022</u>. Registration form is in this issue of the VOICE. All Beef Animals must have a USDA 840 Tag.
- 2) All breeding animals must be registered with 4-H and a copy of breed association registration papers must be submitted to the office by July 1. If you do not register the animals, you will be unable to show them in 4-H. If you do not have registration papers, they will have to show in the crossbred class (commercial) in all species. Heifers, ewes and does must have a state breeding tag to be eligible to show in a 4-H class. Breeding animals may be leased but must have the lease agreement on file with the office by July 1.
- 3) All market swine, goats and sheep must be owned and registered by <u>May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022</u>. They will be ear tagged and weighed prior to Spring Show. <u>Sheep and Goats on May 24<sup>th</sup> and Swine</u> on May 25<sup>th</sup>.

All Swine must have an USDA 840 tag and Sheep and Goats must have a MD scrapie tag.

- 4) 4-H'ers must <u>own</u> their Livestock project market animals.
- 5) There is no substitution of market animals once they have been registered and tagged. You may tag only 5 beef, and sheep, 4 swine (but only show and sell 3) and 3 goats. If you intend to show at the state fair, you may tag more than these limits, but they may only be shown at the state fair.

- 6) If your animal loses its state ear tag, save the tag and contact the office at once for a replacement tag. No animal will be shown or weighed in at the fair that does not have a 4-H tag.
- 7) All male animals must be castrated prior to ear tagging or they will not be tagged.
- 8) You <u>must</u> turn in a record book to the 4-H office to be able to show livestock the following year.

The date will be announced when the site is up and running. You must take the training if:

- 1. First year showing your horse
- 2. Moved up an age division

DATES TO REMEMBER FOR REQUIRED PAPERWORK:

Horse and Pony Cards due – May 31<sup>st</sup>! Horse Leases due – May 31<sup>st</sup>!

#### **HORSEMANSHIP STANDARDS**

Horsemanship Standards are a means to measure youth's knowledge and riding ability. All 4-H'ers must pass riding and knowledge levels 1&2 to participate in county 4-H horse shows. If you need to be tested for any levels please contact the 4-H Office. We will be hosting a testing in the spring. If you need to be tested, please email Jeanne at jeanneh@umd.edu


